- Sierra MacEachron finalized a new digital version of CHAT Profiles in collaboration with the CHAT coordinators. This profile was created using ArcGIS StoryMap based on previous feedback from CHAT members requesting a digital, interactive, and comprehensive profile. The first profile for Clinton Township was presented to and shared with all CHATs, and feedback was largely positive. Profiles will be created for the remaining CHATs in 2023. 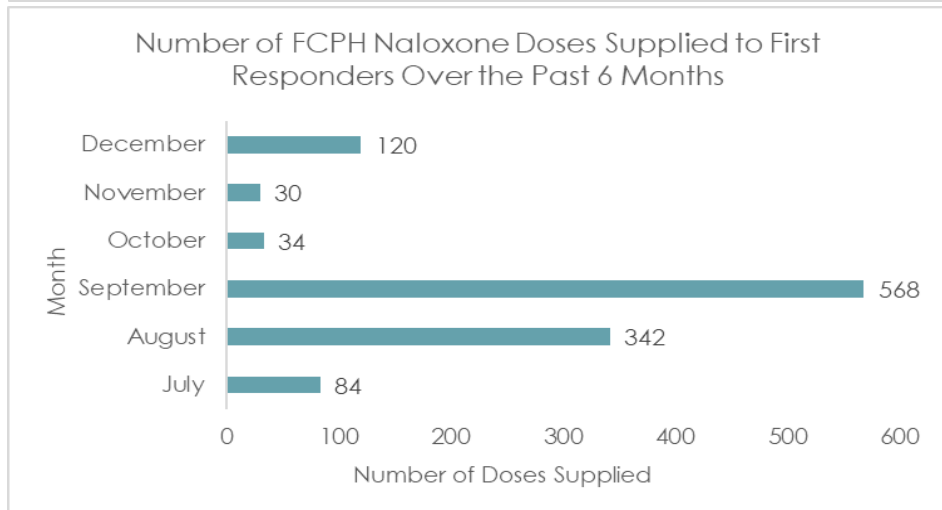
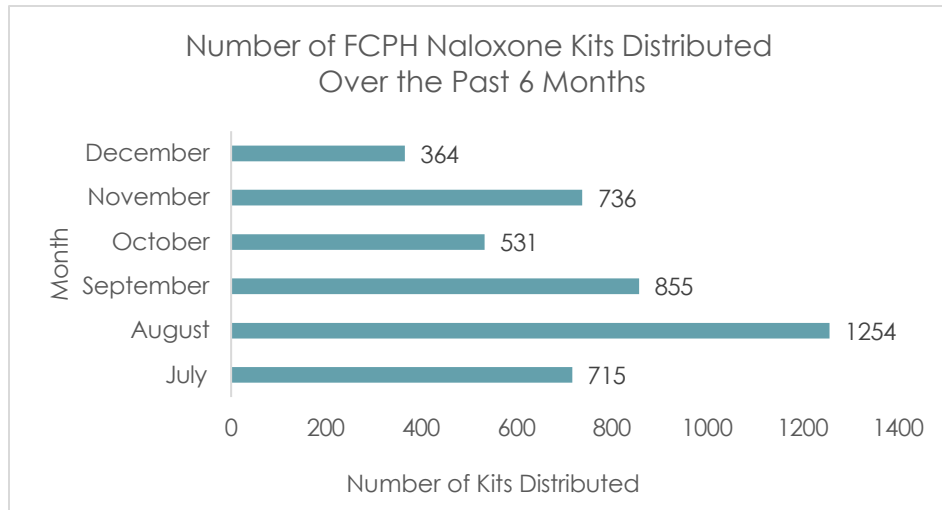
Behavioral Health & Addiction Services (BHAS)

Community Naloxone Distribution Activities:

In December, FCPH's naloxone distribution efforts continued to run at full capacity through the Integrated Naloxone Access and Infrastructure grant (IN23) funded by the Ohio Department of Health (ODH).

- The IN23 grant ended on 12/31/2022. The Naloxone Program received an extension of funding agreement from ODH from 1/1/2023 through 3/31/2023 to continue to fund naloxone distribution and education while a new grant is developed.
- Due to ODH quarterly and annual reporting requirements, as well as expected data collection barriers at the end of the month due to the holidays, data from distribution partners was collected on December 19th rather than at the end of the month. The naloxone distribution numbers below reflect this mid-month data collection and are lower than previous months. Remaining data from distribution partners for the end of December will be reflected in January and on February's Board Report.
- FCPH's Naloxone Program sent 126 naloxone kits in the mail and distributed the rest through community outreach strategies and partner organizations. Jordan's Crossing distributed 30 kits; the Office of Justice Policy and Programs distributed 42 kits; and FCPH distributed 166 to agencies and through community naloxone trainings and outreach events.
- FCPH supplied First Responders with 120 doses of naloxone through the Ohio Mental Health and Addiction Services (OMHAS) First Responder naloxone funding and through the Project Deaths Avoided with Naloxone (DAWN) funding. Naloxone for first responders is used during an opioid overdose event only and is not distributed to the community for opioid overdose prevention and education efforts.
- FCPH conducted a Community Naloxone Training for OhioHealth Family Practice residents at Grant Medical Center.

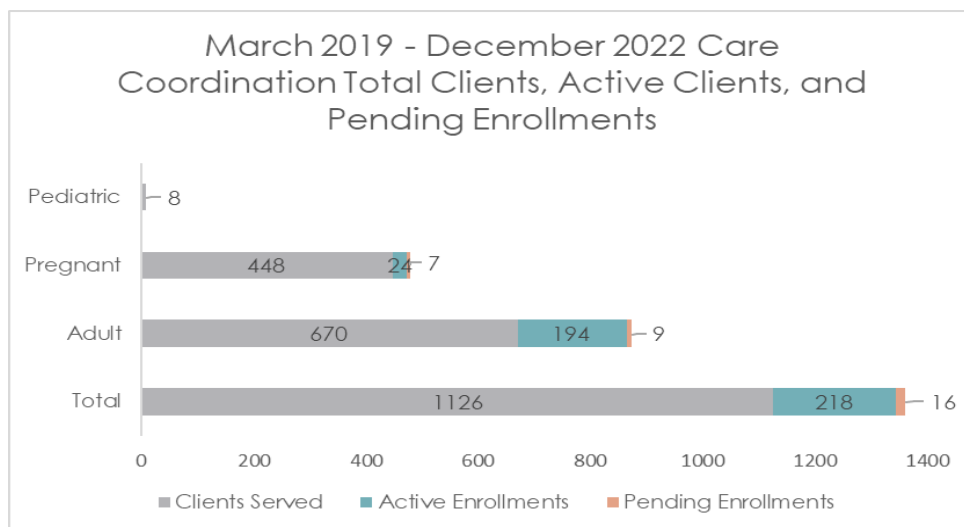

- Elizabeth De Luca-Kontchou provided 1 Youth Cessation training in December with 6 total attendees and hosted 2 Art Advocacy Subgroup meetings. The Art Advocacy Subgroup (a subgroup of the Franklin County Vaping Task Force) is planning February youth policy and prevention activities at Reynoldsburg High School Summit Campus.
- Elizabeth De Luca-Kontchou hosted 1 meeting of the E-Waste Subgroup (a subgroup of the Franklin County Vaping Task Force) on December 29th, to continue planning a county-wide response to e-cigarette and vape waste in schools.
- The Tobacco Program attended the African American Male Wellness Agency committee meeting and spoke to the group briefly regarding FCPH’s Tobacco Initiatives and Health Equity.
- Eric West met with Communications to initiate planning for Tobacco Retail License (TRL) communications strategy and has begun creating list of TRL processes/needs.

Care Coordination Activity:

- Community Health Worker (CHW) Spotlight: Luul Ahmed, CHW, has played a vital role in Franklin County Public Health's (FCPH) response to the measles outbreak by serving as a liaison between FCPH and the Somalian community. Luul, a Somalian Community Activist, continues to offer insight into cultural taboos regarding vaccine hesitancy and sharing solutions with FCPH Leadership to better reach communities. She has assisted the FCPH Communication's staff by reviewing translated health information and providing edits to deliver clearer communication. Luul also has volunteered to work measles outreach events and clinics to serve as a liaison and translator in FCPH's efforts to improve childhood vaccination rates in affected communities.
- New Hire: Danielle Helton has joined the CC team as the newest CHW. Danielle is a certified Peer Recovery Supporter and has professional experience serving individuals struggling with mental health and substance use disorders. Through her lived experience, Danielle looks forward to serving residents as a part of the CC team after she completes her HUB onboard training on January 20, 2023.

Community Engagement & Health Promotion (CEHP)

Community Health Action Teams (CHATs) Activity:

- Westerville, Hilliard, Prairie Township, and Upper Arlington took a break from their meetings in December as many people are out for the holidays and gives a rest for the hard work the members have done

throughout the year.

- Eastside CHAT annual successes and improvements:
 - Respect and trust are integral to community outreach
 - Community involvement is integral to community outreach
 - Community outreach is the best way to give community resources, along with being imperative to rebuilding community relationships post-Covid 19
 - FCPH is doing well showcasing what resources we have available and trying to reach harder to reach populations
 - FCPH areas for improvement; to be more integrated into communities and neighborhoods, to be in non-traditional spaces with non-traditional hours
- The CHAT Coordinators continue planning the CHAT Summit 2022, which is scheduled to be held on January 24, 2023.

Produce Market:

- Clinton Township held 1 fresh produce market, served a total of 299 individuals, with 20 new families
- Clinton Township Produce Market Survey was conducted on 12/09, report analysis:
 - Survey was distributed to 107 cars with 34 responses, a **response rate of ~32%**. The goal response rate was 30 which was met and exceeded
 - **Average rating of 4.91/5** for both FCPH CHAT Coordinator customer service; volunteer customer service and Clinton Township Fire/EMS customer service
 - **Average rating of 4.91/5** assessed how much the produce market helps with the clients' **food insecurity needs**
 - When asked if there were additional resources that clients would like to receive while in line, **2 respondents replied they "didn't know what was available" and "water"**
 - When asked if they had heard of Community Health Action Teams, there was a slight majority of respondents who had not heard of CHATs at, **47% responded "Yes" and 53% "No"**
 - Additionally, **3 respondents** input their email and indicated they would like to be added to the Clinton Township CHAT email distribution list

Emergency Preparedness (EP)

- Covid-19 clinic update: The final Covid clinic was held on December 10th, 2022. A total of 72 individuals were vaccinated for Covid-19 and 37 individuals were vaccinated for flu. This was a successful conclusion to our Covid specific clinics at Mid-Ohio Food Collective.
- Test Kit Giveaway: The EP team, additional FCPH staff and Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) Volunteers hosted a test kit giveaway event called "Test the Season" at memorial hall on Monday December 19th. The team passed out a total of 478 individual tests to the public that drove through or walked up to receive kits. This event was created to help keep the public safe as they gather for the holiday season and to help disperse test kits from the FCPH stockpile before expiration.

- Stop The Bleed: Stop the Bleed (STB) is a national campaign aimed to teach civilians how to treat other civilians in any mass causality or wound injury situation. The EP team coordinates and promotes these trainings to the community.
