# Year of the Parks Update

Work and meetings for Year of the Parks continues!

### Parkview Trees

With the completion of the Jeffrey Manion renovations, the City has partnered with the Bexley Community Foundation to upgrade the tree lawn on Parkview. The declining crab apple and golden rain trees will be removed by the City to make way for replacement Persian Ironwood trees. The Persian Ironwood represents a new species for our municipal arboretum and has many beneficial features including colorful leaves, disease resistance, and a moderate height, which is optimal given the utility poles in the area.

The Trees for Bexley 2022 fall campaign focused on raising private funds for this project. The success of this campaign and the generosity of donors ensured this project will be completed without cost to residents. Work for this project is underway and I'm looking forward to seeing our newest trees once the plantings are complete.

## Human Resources RFP

The City of Bexley is seeking proposals from human resource consultants to assist the City. Proposals are due by March 22, 2023 and should include support for the following HR functions:

Hiring process management Discipline management Pay scale and pay equity management Workers' Compensation management Employee training Employee evaluation standardization and tracking Employee complaints/investigations Health insurance and benefits enrollment and management

The Request for Proposal requests hourly rates for service with billable hours for the contract are estimated at 80 to 100 hours per month.



## Community Belonging / Anti-Racism Programming

We're continuing to work full-speed ahead in partnership with the school district and the library on a community education program focused around coaching white allyship for black residents; fostering a greater sense of belonging for all community members; and educating the community on the historical context of systemic racism in America and Bexley. Our third planning meeting is later this week, and we hope to broaden input reach as we finalize details for the program.

## Columbus Regional ESID

Last week, I was honored to accept nomination as chair of the Columbus Regional ESID. Formed in 2015, the Columbus Regional ESID enables lenders to offer Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) financing in a specified geographic area in the Columbus Region. The geography changes over time as properties in non-ESID areas request to be added to the ESID to enable property owner access to PACE financing. Bexley joined the ESID as part of our City Hall and Service Garage solar panel project, and as a board member I've been active in helping establish greater incentives to developers to nudge projects toward higher efficiency gains. https://columbusregionalesid.com
