Bexley Receives SolSmart Gold Designation

Bexley has applied for certification and received a Gold designation from the national SolSmart program for encouraging the growth of clean, affordable solar energy at the local level. As a SolSmart Gold designee, Bexley has adopted nationally recognized best practices to advance solar market growth. We worked with SolSmart's no-cost technical assistance team to increase local knowledge of solar energy so the entire community can benefit. SolSmart is led by the Interstate Renewable Energy Council (IREC) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA) and funded by the U.S. Department of Energy Solar Energy Technologies Office. Nearly 500 cities, towns, counties, and regional organizations have achieved SolSmart designation since the program launched in 2016.
