

## Adirondack Chairs Update



### Jawana Smith Day

Friday, February 16, 2024 was Officer Jawana Smith Day! Officer Smith was sworn in on August 22, 1996 as the first African-American police officer of the Bexley Police Department. Now a civilian supervisor with the FBI, Jawana has enjoyed an exciting career, and I was honored and humbled to be able to present her with this proclamation earlier today.

### Livingston Avenue Updates

Following feedback from the February 13 City Council Meeting relating to vehicular and pedestrian safety along the corridor, Council President Lampke spurred a meeting with myself, the Chief, Safety Chair Makham, and representatives from Columbus City Police regarding ongoing safety concerns in the Livingston Avenue area. Columbus shared information on policing and stats for the area, and we discussed ways to partner in the area. In general, consensus has been that the lane reconfiguration has enhanced safety in the area, slowing speeds and lowering the severity of crashes. We've also followed up with letters and emails to invite owners of properties in the Ferndale/Mayfield area to a meeting in March to explore opportunities to coordinate on the environmnetal remediation at the former Holtzmann Landfill.
