Mayor's Update to City Council

Chelsea and Main Update

If you've noticed the work occurring at Chelsea and Main, two projects are happening concurrently. The City is driving a project to environmentally remediate the former gas station at the corner, and the current site cleanup involves demolition in order to prepare the site for future remediation via a grant that is being actively sought from the State of Ohio's Brownfield Revitalization Fund (while waiting for the grant, the site will be re-seeded and maintained as grass). The southwest corner (former Boston Market) is the Katalina's Bexley location under way, helped in part by BZAP's approval last month of a City-provided facade grant to assist with exterior improvements to the property. It's exciting to see this section of the City being refreshed.

Drought and the Bexley Arboretum

Speaking of drought, while this latest severe heat is mercifully about to break, our trees and plants have been suffering mightily over this very dry and hot summer. Bexley Arborist Spencer Martin recently posted a great article to the @bexleyarboretum instagram account. I've included an excerpt, but the full article is available on Instagram at @bexleyarboretum.

"Bexley Arboretum is currently experiencing drought conditions, so you may notice some trees are changing. Leaf curling, marginal browning, chlorosis and early fall color are all responses to drought. Eventually, most trees will defoliate (drop their leaves) when they experience prolonged drought conditions. This is an adaptation to limit water loss..."


Hiring Update/City Hall Reconfiguration


