Year of the Parks - Update:

- The Commonwealth Park Pond is officially filled with water and open for the community to enjoy. Please take a walk by this beautiful addition to Commonwealth.
- We received great news over break as the city was awarded a state grant of \$500,000 for the construction of the pedestrian bridge at Schneider Park which will connect the Bexley trail system with the greenways trail system on the west side of Alum Creek.
- The Skate Park Committee has reviewed a handful of conceptual drawings for the new skate park. The committee continues to work with Hunger Skate Parks in preparation for the public workshop on Thur., Jan. 18th at 6p at City Hall. We encourage the community to attend the public meeting to give feedback on design concepts as we continue planning for the future skate park.



• We will hold a public workshop on Wed. Jan 24th at 530p at City Hall to discuss the plans for Commonwealth. During the workshop, we will present several design concepts that have been developed with the park's unification in mind. These designs reflect our commitment to preserving the park's natural beauty while introducing elements that will enrich the visitor experience. A crucial aspect of this proposal involves the closure of the block of Columbia Avenue that runs between Commonwealth North and South. To ensure that you are fully informed about the implications of this change, we will also share traffic studies that detail the impact of this closure.

Preservation and Enhancement Committee - Update:

- The committee has set the next three meetings in the process to develop a master plan for the preservation and enhancement of Jeffrey Park. The meeting schedule includes the following:
