The City of Bexley launched our first electric aggregation program in September 2023. Since then, 3,300 electric meters have joined the program to use wind energy RECs and are saving an average of \$40 monthly on their electric bill from the standard AEP rate. Collectively, program participants have saved \$600,000+ since the program began! Sign up at bexley.org/aggregation.

Arboretum

Biking

The City is currently working on enhanced bike infrastructure through the development of bike boulevards-a recommendation of the Bike Friendly Bexley Plan-and more! Food Waste Recycling

We are proud to offer curbside food waste recycling as a service to every household in Bexley at no additional charge. Additionally, there is a publicly available drop-off at Bexley City Hall. Litter Pickup

Our litter pickup program focuses on volunteer service and education relating to quality of life, litter, recycling, and beautification. Plastic

Recycling

Single-use plastic bags are banned in Bexley at non-restaurant retail establishments. Don't forget your reusable bags before heading out to shop!

Rumpke accepts the following clean and loose items curbside; no need to sort! Report a pick up miss at <u>bexley.org/reportamiss</u>:

Glass Bottles and Jars (all colors)

Metal Cans: Aluminum cans, steel cans and lids, empty aerosol cans with lids and tips removed

 Plastic Bottles (empty, crush, reattach lid): Bottles and jugs that have a small mouth and wider base, such as milk jugs, soda bottles, laundry detergent bottles, water bottles, shampoo bottles, and contact solution bottles

• Plastic Tubs: Containers for butter, sour cream, cottage cheese, yogurt, snack cups, and fruit slices fall into the tub category. Lids should be reattached prior to recycling

Plastic Cups (remove/discard straw, reattach lid): Fast food beverage cups Paper: Newspaper, magazines, cardboard (break down), mixed office paper and envelopes, paperboard (cereal boxes), pizza boxes free of food debris and grease, telephone books, and catalogs

Paper Cups (remove/discard lids, straws, and stoppers): Fast food beverage cups, coffee cups, Dixie cups

Cartons: Food/beverage cartons such as milk, juice, soup, wine, broth, and

There are a variety of opportunities to recycle or otherwise discard unique items at specific times during the year, including string lights and expanded polystyrene. The Green Bexley Cleanup Day will be held this year on April 27, and a list of accepted materials is available at <u>bexley.org/earthandarbor</u>.

Solar

Bexley is seeking ways to encourage solar energy development in our community, including through code revisions and a solar co-op. For more information about the basics of solar energy, your solar options, and questions to ask solar professionals, visit bexley.org/solar.

Trash

Bagged trash in labeled receptacles is picked up each Monday. Report a missed pickup at bexley.org/reportamiss. Call 1-800-989-1373 for a bulk pickup. Upholstered items need to be wrapped in plastic, which is available for rental at Bexley City Hall for \$25, \$20 of which is returned upon returning the roll.

Zero Waste

Bexley's Zero Waste Plan was adopted in 2017 and includes ways Bexley can achieve its goal of reducing 90% of materials disposed at the landfill by 2040. See the Zero Waste Plan at bexley.org/plans.
