

Recreation Board Meeting:

- The Recreation Board met on Wed., April 3rd at 5:30p at City Hall.
 - The board held a public hearing to discuss the concept of adding lights to the Solomon Pickleball Courts.
 - Roughly 35 people attended with 12 residents speaking about pickleball lights.
 - Comments included pickleball players that were for the lights, area residents that were against the lights, and everything in between.
 - The board will discuss the lights at the May meeting, but will not consider a vote on the lights until the June meeting at the earliest.
 - The Bexley Bloomers talked with the board about the upcoming Bloomers season. The Bloomers provide information/stats on the 2023 season, with nearly 1,000 hours of community service provided. The Bloomer also invited the board, and all lovers of Jeffrey Park, to join them on Thursday mornings to garden around park. - Thank you to all of the staff that worked to organize this event and battle the weather to provide this experience for our community.


Solar Eclipse at the Park - Monday, April 8th:

- Bexley Recreation and Parks along with the Bexley Public Library will host an eclipse event on Monday, April 8th at Jeffrey Park.
- The event will run from 1230p 4p in the back meadow at Jeffrey Park.
- The event will include food trucks, music, crafts, inflatable games and more.
- Activities will run from 1230p-230p and then visitors will be encouraged to throw down a blanket or chairs and watch the eclipse which will reach maximum coverage at approximately 3:12p.

Skate Park Public – Update:

- We held a public workshop on Wed., March 27th. We had roughly 20 people in attendance to discuss the latest skate park design.
- We updated the public on the implications of the most recent design including the cost estimates and concerns about the footprint of the design.
- The most current iteration of the skate park design has an estimated price tag of \$717k for the base. This amount exceeds our current budget for the project. Additionally, as we laid out the footprint on site of the current design, it raised some concerns about the scale of the skate park.
- We have reached out to the design team to look at potential adjustments to the
 design to scale back the size and reduce the price. The goal is to adjust the
 design while maintaining the sprite of the current design, which has great
 support.
- We will meet with the Skate Park Committee and the design team to continue to finalize a design that we are all excited about and one that fits well into the park space and within the budget.
