### 2200 East Main Update

Demolition activity is coming soon to 2200 East Main, the site of the former Trinity Apartments. Over the next few weeks, expect to see increased activity at the site including City of Columbus firefighters using the old buildings for training (no live burns), non-profits removing old appliances and fixtures for reuse, and ultimately the arrival of large equipment for building demolition.
