

Budget Thank You

Over the last several weeks, the 2025 budget has been front and center for my administration. A truly astounding amount of work and time has been invested in this intensive process and I believe the budget documents reflect the impressive depth and scope of this effort. As you can imagine, many hands support the creation of the budget and I want to extend my gratitude to my directors and support staff who each demonstrated passion for their department goals, and balanced this with a commitment to responsible stewardship of public funds.

Most especially, I want to call out Karrie Martin, who truly rose to the occasion of tackling her first budget for the City, and Megan Meyer, who worked tirelessly to help develop the document and narrative that will help guide our discussions. I'm proud of my team and this document and am looking forward to sharing everything in more depth with you over the coming weeks.

Land Use Strategy Update

At their regular meeting yesterday, the Land Use Strategy Commission was presented with the results of the real estate market analysis conducted by DiSalvo Development Advisors. The analysis provided the Commission with a deep dive into supply and demand for various end uses including restaurant, retail, boutique hotel, medical, and independent living. The Commission is also pursuing various maps and illustrations to include in the draft report with the help of OHM Advisors, the City's planning consultant. With these tools, staff will work with Commission members to draft the report itself which we anticipate being introduced to Council in late January.

The Community Builders Hosting Community Meetings

TCB is hosting a series of public engagement meetings to gather feedback prior to submitting plans for 2300 East Livingston and 420 North Cassady to the City of Bexley. As of October 22, 2024, no plans have been submitted by TCB to the City of Bexley for consideration. Once plans are submitted, they would go through the appropriate staff and board review process, including but not limited to the Architectural Review Board, Tree and Public Gardens Commission, Board of Zoning and Planning, and Bexley City Council.
