Water Bill Relief Program & Water Consumption Monitoring

This week, we held an internal meeting to discuss the scope of the Water Bill Relief Program. This program would help to offset the cost of unusually high water bills (due to in-home plumbing issues impacting water use) for residents with financial need. This effort will help to formalize the City's existing efforts to help offset these costs in special circumstances. The initial policy has been drafted and is being reviewed internally with plans for a rollout this spring. This program will also work closely with an optional water use monitoring system, Aqua Hawk, which will be available this spring and will automatically provide high-water-use alerts to residents who sign up. Communications plans are being developed for both of these projects and we'll keep Council up to date as the details come together.

Talking to our Kids About Digital Safety

The pressures and pitfalls facing our kids in online spaces are frightening, and there can be dire real world consequences when kids don't know how to ask for help or don't feel safe in doing so. There have been a couple stark reminders of this in Bexley over the past few weeks, and it's another prompt to talk to encourage residents to talk to their kids about the real world dangers posed by bad internet actors, and help create an environment where their kids know they can safely turn to them if they are in trouble. There are countless resources to help us as parents communicate with our kids and build safe rules and a safe(r) internet environment for them, and Know to Protect site provided by the Department of Homeland Security (https://www.dhs.gov/know2protect) provides a good start.



State and Federal Legislative Update

House Bill 26

On January 28, 2025, fifteen members of the Ohio House of Representatives renewed a bill that aims to require Ohio political subdivisions to participate in federal immigration-enforcement actions moving forward. If the political subdivision does not do so, then the state would subtract ten percent of the political subdivision's allotted Local Government Funds ("LGF").

As a local jurisdiction, we don't have a role in investigating immigration status, and we don't intend to divert everimportant local law enforcement resources into doing so now. Our public safety focus will continue to be centered around preventing crime in our community, rigorously investigating crime when it does occur, and providing the tools and infrastructure for a safe and welcoming community. Beyond this, it should be noted that House Bill 26 is far from being enacted as law, but we'll continue to monitor progress closely.
