Aggregation Update

Wtih the full support of City Council, the City entered our current aggregation program in September 2023. This program has saved our residents a collective \$1,202,793.80 and has increased our community's use and support of sustainable energy options.

With the program expiring this May, and electric utility markets shifting upwards right now, it will be important to weigh our options for how to best bring value and continued renewable energy to the community in a rapidly shifting and uncertain market.

While we can re-engage with a new aggregation program, we can also wait and see what happens with AEP rates early this summer before finalizing aggregation plans.

Jeffrey Woods Festival - New Offerings!

Jeffrey Woods Festival is coming up this Saturday and this year we've got more fun than ever. Six Triple Eight with Senators Craig and Reynolds

Earlier in February I had the privilege of welcoming state legislators and community advocates to a special viewing of the documentary *Six Triple Eight* at Jeffrey Mansion. The 6888th Battalion holds a revered place in history as the only all-Black, all-female battalion to serve overseas during World War II. This remarkable group of women was tasked with eliminating an overwhelming backlog of undelivered mail and ensuring that American servicemembers received vital correspondence from their loved ones. Two Ohio Senators, Senator Craig and Senator Reynolds, have introduced Ohio Senate Bill 17 which aims to honor these extraordinary women and I was able to join them at a special viewing of this documentary which was both moving and inspiring.
