April 18 Update from the Ohio Municipal League:

It was a quiet week at the Ohio Statehouse, with both chambers of the Legislature on recess. They return the week of April 28, when focus will predominantly be on the Senate's budget hearings. A few items of note are below:

- The Ohio House recently passed House Bill 28, legislation sponsored by Rep. Adam Mathews (R-Lebanon) and Rep. Thomas Hall (R-Butler County) that would eliminate the authority to levy replacement property tax levies. The Ohio Senate has already received sponsor testimony on the bill, and OML urges our members to have your opponent testimony ready for when a hearing is called. - OML members are invited to a webinar to receive an update on the latest legislative happenings at the Ohio Statehouse. It will take place from 11 a.m.-Noon on April 24. The registration link is available here.
- The Montrose Group will host its Fourth Annual Economic Development & Policy Forum on May 22-23, with the focus of the forum being "Preparing to Win." The event will take place at the Hilton Easton in Columbus, and is available at no cost to participants. If you'd like more information on this, reach out to Natalie.
- ODOT will be hosting its first round of meetings for the Access Ohio 2050 long-range transportation plan. The meetings will take place throughout the month of May and include stakeholder meetings from 1-3 p.m. and public meetings from 5-6:30 p.m. at various locations and on various dates.
- Gov. DeWine nominated John Logue to replace Anne Vogel as director of the Ohio EPA. Logue has served in numerous leadership capacities at the Ohio Bureau of Workers Compensation and will need to be confirmed by the Ohio Senate. Vogel was appointed as the U.S. EPA Region 5 administrator.

Ohio lawmakers want to ban police departments from having arrest and traffic ticket quotas.

SB 114, sponsored by state Sen. Tom Patton, R-Strongsville, would forbid law enforcement agencies in Ohio from giving officers quotas for arrests or tickets. Agencies engoifically could or tickets. Agencies specifically could not base an officer's discipline, promo-
