Slow Down Bexley!

Slow Down Bexley launched this past Friday, and we've already seen yard signs and stickers popping up around the community. This campaign strives to create safe and comfortable streets for all road users, and formalizes a process we've had in place in Bexley for many years, including some expanded data analysis for the speed studies that have occured over the past few years. Our aim through Slow Down Bexley is to offer a more transparent, data-driven approach to speed management, and to equip community members with tools to raise speed awareness and better understand speeding in their neighborhood.

Through the bexley.org/slowdown/ website, community members can view historic speed survey data, request a speed study, request a toolkit of Slow Down Bexley promotional materials, and learn more about speed control techniques.

Pedestrian Bridge is Out to Bid

After applying for and receiving significant grant funding from the State of Ohio Capital Fund, ODNR, and the Bexley Community Foundation, and then working through an extensive engineering process, the Schneider Park bike and pedestrian bridge is going to bid within the next week. The bridge will provide cyclists and walkers with direct connection to the Alum Creek bike trail via the Schneider Park multi-purpose trail, a great enhancement for cyclists and for our park system in general. Stay tuned for more info once the project is awarded and construction kickoff gets underway.
