## Homicide at 540 N. Cassady

It is always deeply tragic when a life is lost to violence, and such incidents are especially rare here in Bexley. Last week, Bexley Police responded to a homicide at 540 North Cassady Avenue, and since then our Detective Bureau has been working tirelessly to bring those responsible to justice. The murder of Demetrese Norgett is a heartbreaking reminder of the regional wave of youth and gun violence affecting communities across Central Ohio. In addition to the criminal investigation, the City is reviewing operations at the supportive housing property at 540 North Cassady. My resolve couldn't be clearer - this property must, and will be, turned around. We are requiring the owners to take immediate corrective action to ensure responsible management and resident safety. Our hearts go out to all affected by this tragedy, and the City remains fully committed to protecting the safety and wellbeing of every member of our community.

## Budget Process Update

Staff have been working super hard on getting the first budget draft to this council meeting. Huge kudos to Karrie, Megan, Natalie, and all our directors for busting tail over the past several weeks to coordinate through this process.

## Schneider Park Bridge Bids

Bids are in on the bridge, and we believe we are in good shape to move forward. We'll be holding a Board of Control meeting at the next council meeting date (11/11) to review and hopefully approve a winning bid. The project cost is coming in just over \$1.2m, with \$850,000 secured in grants from the state capital fund and ODNR, and the balance coming from BCF Year of Parks grant and TIF funding, all of which has been adequately appropriated for this project

## Roosevelt Avenue Medians Workshop

Thanks to a grant from the Bexley Beautification Fund, we're working on concepts for refreshing the landscaping on the North Roosevelt medians to the north and south of Denver Avenue.
