

Council Update – Chief of Police

February 22, 2016

Chief's Comments: Our four member detective bureau and our patrol shifts are doing a very good job. We have sergeants assigned to new positions and there is much enthusiasm among that knowledgeable, experienced group. Of the three new hires, two have completed their conditional requirements and the third should do the same this week. Very soon I expect to announce the time and date the mayor will administer the oath of office to all three officers. They will immediately enter into their field training program. We are very much looking forward to all three of those officers completing their FTO period and becoming solo on the street. We are also looking forward to moving forward with the part-time dispatcher program. When those two initiatives come to fruition we should see a significant slowing in our use of overtime dollars.

Detective Sergeant Comments: Detective Evans was assigned 9 cases over the past two weeks. He attended a week long "Interview and Interrogation" class and reported to headquarters several times after class to further investigate his case load. Detective Evans issued two arrest warrants, one felony warrant and one misdemeanor warrant. He submitted evidence from three cases to BCI, indicted three suspects through grand jury and conducted three search warrants. Detective Evans also investigated several theft cases including talking to witnesses and collecting video evidence. Detective Evans was also recently assigned an alleged sexual assault case that he is currently investigating.

Detective Kim was assigned 10 cases over the past two weeks. He also attended the week long "Interview and Interrogation" class. Detective Kim issued one warrant for Breaking and Entering. He attempted several times to track down the suspect but was unsuccessful. He also completed four grand jury packets, conducted two juvenile "well-being" checks and conducted one search warrant. In addition, Detective Kim conducted several criminal interviews with suspects and closed five cases.

Detective Tumblison was also assigned 10 cases over the past two weeks. He issued three felony warrants out of a burglary case and arrested the ring leader, Jeremy Jones. Detective Tumblison spent two hours interviewing the Jones and gained valuable information that will help with the case. He also conducted a search warrant on Jeremy Jones vehicle, gathering more evidence. Detective Tumblison also made another felony arrest on a different case, testified in one grand jury hearing, processed a recovered stolen vehicle and closed ten cases.
