

Mayor's Update to City Council April 10, 2018

Dog Park Study Group Update

On April 9, the Dog Park Study Group met onsite at Schneider Park to survey the cleared area of the park, and then met back at City Hall to workshop ideas for the park with landscape designer Elena Andrews. The space being considered is an approximately 1 acre site to the north of the boardwalk. The plan will address drainage, surface prep, and dog park amenities. The group will meet again after a draft plan is created to workshop the draft plan, and Council will be kept up to date. This is a similar process that was entered into for the North Community Garden project, in order to seek and obtain grant funding.

Meeting with Columbus re: Livingston Corridor Planning

On April 9, President Feibel, Service Director Dorman, and I met with a group of representative from the City of Columbus which included their Director of Public Service, Director of Planning, Director of Development, and included representatives from the finance department and the Mayor's cabinet. We discussed entering into a planning process for Livingston Avenue streetscape, land use, and infrastructure. The next steps are for us to jointly develop a scope of work for the planning process. Once a scope of work has reached draft form I will circulate it to Council for feedback.

Schneider Park Main Street Trailhead Design Update

We have been working for several months with Brian Kent Jones' landscape architects to create concepts for a Schneider Park Main Street trailhead and plaza. This design project is being funded by a grant from the Bexley Community Foundation that was awarded in 2016. We are getting to the point where design options are being honed, and we will be having a public workshop to discuss the options in the coming months. The hope is to have a plan firmed up prior to any development being proposed
