The Bexley Patio Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA) concept

Since discussing this in the spring of last year with Council, Matt Klingler and I have been working on advancing the concept and are readying an application to bring to Council. A draft of the application is attached to the agenda.

Next steps are:

- Mayor files a formal application with Council aiming for February 9th
- Ordinance approving application is introduced concurrently
- Public notice of application is published for two consecutive weeks (middle-end Feb)
- A public hearing is scheduled (targeting March 9th)
- Council votes on ordinance (March 9 or 23rd)
- If approved, City notifies State Division of Liquor Control
- Signage and initial round of DORA cups are ordered
- DORA can go into effect by mid to late April

Joint Livingston Avenue Plan Update

We met with Columbus representatives and selected the winning bid for the Joint Livingston Avenue plan. NBBJ will be assisting the cities with the plan. The project schedule will look something like this:

Phase 1: Information Gathering (2 months)

Inventory and analysis

Stakeholder interviews
Steering committee launch

Phase 2: Draft Design (4 months)

Confirm findings
Preliminary vision and challenges
Develop concepts
Concept exhibits
Refine draft concepts
Draft final plan

Phase 3: Final Plan and Delivery (5 months)

Refine draft final plan Finalize plan Final plan report and deliverables

Based upon a February launch, the plan is anticipated to be ready for review and adoption by City Council in December 2021 to January 2022

A 2-week incidence rate includes all cases reported over a 14-day time period per 100,000 people.
