The fireworks themselves were terrific, and the event was really nice, so I just thought I'd pass along what I consider to be two opportunities for Bexley to do even better.

Also, and more importantly, I just looked at the findings of the recent traffic citation study completed by BRAIR, and it is upsetting to see that it seems like there hasn't been progress on the disparity in traffic stops. I would be interested to hear what Council plans to do to address continued disparity.
