- Fair/ Earth Month It'll be in April! Elizabeth will begin planning the Fair and Earth Month activities beginning in January. If you're interested in working with her on this, please let her know by December 27.

- Aggregation This is still a work in progress, as prices have increased; there are ideas about implementation despite the market.
- Universal Recycling "Hot and heavy" in 2022.
- SUP Phase II Begins in January! Communication has gone out to restaurants and they are invited to an upcoming informational meeting.
- Sustainability Programs Coordinator A part time position has been approved as part of the budget to assist the City on environmental goals and strategies. The position is currently posted.
- Electric in the budget Two electric pickup trucks and one electric car will be funded through the budget to transition the fleet to electric. There is currently a moratorium on non-electric pick up trucks. Additionally, the Mayor has a concept for a two stroke engine ban that will prohibit these in the future.

Climate Action Plan

- GHG Emissions Consultant Jon-Paul d'Aversa has been leading Bexley through an inventory of our greenhouse gas emissions through the Power a Clean Future Ohio (PCFO) communities program. The goal of this work is for us to emerge with a clear sense of our emissions footprint and its sources and to develop a climate action plan that is actionable, equitable, and inclusive for all City residents. Jon-Paul has recently completed a draft inventory which is under review, and once that is complete we will be ready to develop an action plan to reduce our city's emissions.
- Equity Coaching By signing on as a PCFO community, we have also had the opportunity to participate in equity coaching with consultant Jennifer Sconyers. The first two sessions have helped us identify some potential areas in which to focus our efforts to build equity and inclusion into our environmental programs as ESAC and the City of Bexley. We're looking forward to our third coaching session in January where we will put more details around our commitments and plans for 2022 in this area.

- BCSD SWACO approved BCSD's \$15,042.00 grant request for water-bottle filling station fountains.
- **Capital** Capital has been donated 99 new waste containers to be put in the dormitories over winter break. This means students will have accessible composting and recycling on every floor of all the dorms. We also reapplied for Tree Campus USA and got it approved by the state, now it goes to the Arbor Day Foundation for review. As well, we are looking into a grant that would allow us to have on-site compost drying which would decrease pickup dates from daily to every two weeks, saving on emissions. We will continue to work with Earth Peak Organics on this.

• Feet on the Street – There will be an information session in January for a Feet on the Street grant. If you are interested in working on this grant and/or program, please let Elizabeth know by December 27.

Jan. 6 Virtual Program for Oakwood SuperMOMs – The members are interested in learning how Bexley initiated the city-wide composing program with the intent of working on getting a program started in Oakwood, Ohio. Bexley seems to be very similar to Oakwood and they think learning from us would be great. The organizer of the Green Oakwood group has discussed this topic with us in the past. The MOMs group reaches a slightly different audience so they're hoping to spread broader buy-in for a program by having a speaker from the ESAC discuss the issue.
