AN ORDINANCE. # 13

To regulate the speed of animals, bicycles, tricycles automobiles, motor-cars, motor-cycles and other vehicles ridden driven or propelled upon and along the streets, avenues, alleys and other public ways of the Village of Bexley, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the Village Council of the Village of Bexley, Ohio as follows; to-wit:

Sec. 1. Whoever shall ride or drive any horse or other animal upon any street, avenue, alley or other public thoroughfare or public place in this Village at a greater rate of speed than fifteen (15) miles an hour and whoever shall ride drive or propel or cause to be ridden, driven or propelled upon any street, avenue, alley, public thoroughfare or public place in said Village, any automobile, auto-car or other horseless vehicle, either his own property or the property of another propelled by steam, electricity, gasoline, compressed air or other motive power, at a greater rate of speed than above described; and also any person who shall ride or propel any bicycle, tricycle or motor-cycle upon any of the streets, avenues alleys and public ways or places of said Village at a speed greater than above described shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or be imprisoned not more than thirty (30) days or both, provided however, that so much of this ordinance as has reference to the rate of speed at which any animal, vehicle, automobile, motor-cycle bicycle or tricycle shall be ridden or driven shall not apply to any Marshall, Police or other Officer while in the discharge of his duty *OR a Physician answering an Urgent Call.*

Sec. 2. Whoever shall ride, drive or propel, or cause to be ridden, driven or propelled upon any street, avenue, alley, public thoroughfare or public place in said Village any automobile, auto-car, motor-cycle or other horseless vehicle, either ~~in~~ his own property or the property of another, propelled by steam, electricity gasoline, compressed air or other motive power between the hours of sunset and sunrise without a lamp attached to the rear of such

Automobile, auto-car or other horseless vehicle, and so placed as to illuminate the license number and also without exhibiting a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, or shall fail to give warning by sounding a bell, whistle, horn or gong when danger or accident is imminent, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall upon conviction thereof be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00).

All of this section shall apply to bicycles and tricycles excepting to the requirement of the rear light; they only requiring a light in the direction in which they are proceeding.

Sec. 3. Whoever shall ride, drive or propel or cause to be ridden, driven or propelled upon that part of any street, avenue alley or public highway ^{commonly known as} ~~designated as~~ the side walk any animal automobile, auto-car, motor-cycle, bicycle or other vehicle shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall upon conviction thereof be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty (\$50.00) dollars and shall be confined in Jail until said fine so imposed and the costs of prosecution shall be paid.

Sec. 4. All of the above enumerated offenses shall be prosecuted by the arrest of the perpetrators of said several offenses and also the owners of the animals or other machines or conveyances above specified, who permits the commission of said offenses, and said animals, machines and conveyances, if seized with said offenders and in consequence of said offenses committed, may be held by said Village on the order of the Mayor until the fines and costs of arrests and prosecution are paid in said case.

Sec. 5. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the passage and publication of the same as provided by law.
