

an Ordinance
To prevent the digging up of
any Street, Alley & Sidewalks,
Buxley Ohio February 14, 1911

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Buxley Ohio:

Section 1. That from and after the passage and publication of this Ordinance as provided by law, it shall be deemed a misdemeanor for any person ^{partnership or Corporation} without the written permission of the Mayor or Street Commissioner of the village to dig up, across or along any ^{Street or Alley} sidewalk, in said village, on any part of ^{Street or Alley} lot, or in any space reserved for ^{Street or Alley} sidewalk, in said village, or a part of any platted or publicly dedicated road, and which is in public use as a ^{Street or Alley} sidewalk and as such is in any wise meeting and ^{Street or Alley} crossing the public route of the neighborhood where situated.

Section 2. ^{Partnership or Corporation} Any person ^{violating the provisions of} Section 1 of this Ordinance, to the detriment & ill convenience of the public or any part of it, shall on proper complaint of any one so aggrieved, be charged before the Mayor with said offense and upon trial, shall if found guilty, ^{be} be fined in a sum ^{not less than \$25} and be held to pay the costs of prosecution; and on failure or refusal so to pay to the Mayor or village Clerk said fine or cost shall be liable to imprisonment & stand confined till paid.

Section 3. In addition to said fine, costs and jail sentence, said offender against the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liable to the village of Buxley in a suit at law upon failure or refusal of said offender

2/ to restore said ^{Street} ~~road~~ and dig up said ^{Street} ~~road~~ upon request of said Village so to do; and upon five days written notice to said Offender, given ~~by~~ by the Village Street Commissioners, if said Offender fail or refuse to restore said Side ^{Street} ~~road~~ to its former condition said Village or its said Street Commissioners, may proceed to restore said Side ^{Street} ~~road~~ at the expense of said Offender, in an action at law, if not voluntarily paid:-

Section 4.-

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest date allowed by law succeeding its passage and publication
