The Clerk was instructed to notify the Street Commissioner. The Mayor reported that the clock in the north end did not work at all satisfactorily and that Dan Pixley had agreed to have it repaired, later Mr. Pixley had sent the clock back to the factory for adjustment. Motion carried that the light com. have a light place at Regals corner.

The question of removing the Montgomery house on Broad St was brought up for consideration. After a general discussion the Policeclerk was requested to investigate what action council could take.

Resolution to Amend resolution # 13, known as Resolution to improve Pleasant Ridge Avenue from Broad Street to Carlsruh Avenue.

Whereas the profile, plans and specifications, covered by resolution number 13 and dated May 9th 1911, to improve Pleasant Ridge to Carlsruh Avenue, establishes a street grade at Carlsruh Avenue and south thereof on Pleasant Ridge Avenue entirely too high for the property abutting on said above streets at the intersection points of the above mentioned avenues,

Therefore be it resolved by the council of the Village of Bexley, That said above mentioned resolution number 13 be amended as follows:-

First, that on Pleasant Ridge Avenue, to a point 1/16th part north of Carlsruh Avenue be changed so as to meet the best interests of the property owners in that immediate vicinity and the property abutting thereon; and

Mr Brannamacher then presented the following resolution

Resolution of fortification to the Board of Capitol University.

Whereas it becomes necessary to open Bassady Avenue to Main Street, the said street to conform to the plat and addition known as the Forest Addition to Bexley and therefore requiring 32²⁰ feet off the East side of the tract of Land belonging to the Capitol University in order to give the said Bassady Avenue the proper width at Main Street, the same as delineated on the plat of the Forest Addition, and whereas it is also necessary to open up an alley through this University lot to conform to the aforesaid plat and addition,

Be it therefore resolved to send the following notice through the Village Clerk to the Board of Capitol University:- To the Honorable Board of

Capitol University, Bexley Columbus Ohio.

Whereas it become necessary to extend Bassady Avenue south to Main street, the said Bassady Avenue as now established and proposed to be extended to Main street, passing along and through the east side of the University lot situated on th of Main Street in Bexley, the said extension of said Bassady Avenue as proposed requiring a strip of ground thirty two and seventy hundred (3270) feet wide along the east side over

of the above said lot; and whereas it will also be necessary to open up a fifteen (15) foot alley running east and west through the middle of the above said lot,
You are hereby notified by the Village Council of the Village of Bexley and State of Ohio through its clerk,
That you are requested either to dedicate or to deed to the Village of Bexley of the state of Ohio for street purposes an alley fifteen (15) feet wide through the center of this above mentioned lot and running east and west parallel with Main Street, so as to comply with the general plan of the plat of the lots adjoining this lot, and a strip of ground thirty two and seventy hundredths (32.70) feet wide along the east side of the above mentioned lot so as to become a part of the proposed extension of Cassady Avenue running north and south along and through the east side of said property lot; and
That you are requested to act in this matter and give us an answer within thirty days after the receipt of this notice.

the Central Ohio Railway Co., where Parkview Ave.
has been opened and dedicated to the right of way
line of the said railroad for the reason that this
will give to the Village of Bexley a through
thoroughfare extending from Main St. to Fifth Ave.,
through our best residence territory.
