Above resolution adopted by a full vote of Council. Owing to Prof. Singer declining to serve as Treasurer the Mayor announced the appointment of Leonard Holtzman which was approved by Council.

Report of Light Com.

Mr. Lind reported that the light at Ken Latimer corner had swung until it rested on the feed wire also light on west side of circle was not burning. The clerk was instructed to notify the street commissioner. The Mayor reported that the clock in the north end did not work at all satisfactory and that Ben Pixley had agreed to have it repaired, later Mr. Pixley had sent the clock back to the factory for adjustment. Motion carried that the light be moved to a light place at Regals corner.

The question of removing the Montgomery house on Broad St was brought up for consideration. After a general discussion the solicitor was requested to investigate what action Council could take.

Motion carried that the Street Commissioner be requested by the clerk to inspect the sidewalk

in front of Mr. Cook's residence and if found not according to specifications to notify Mr. Cook at once to comply with the specification.

Also that the clerk notify E. H. Higgins, Col. James Kelbourn and Lincoln Kelbourn that it is the desire of council that they proceed at once to complete their sidewalks. The question of location of sidewalks on Park View Ave was referred to the team for investigation and report to council.

The clerk read an article of contract presented by the Central Union Telephone Co. for use of the poles for the light system for signature. Motion carried that it be referred to the light com. for investigation and that the clerk notify the Company of the action taken by council.

Resolution # 25 was read the third time and presented for adoption as follows

Resolution # 25 presented by G. R. Krummacker.

Resolution to Amend resolution # 13, known as Resolution to improve Pleasant Ridge Avenue from Ground Street to Carlsruh Avenue.

Whereas the profile, plans and specifications, covered by resolution number 13 and dated May 9th, 1911, to improve Pleasant Ridge to Carlsruh Avenue, establishes a street grade at Carlsruh Avenue and south thereof on Pleasant Ridge Avenue entirely too high for the property abutting on said above streets at the intersecting points of the above mentioned avenues,

Therefore be it resolved by the council of the Village of Bexley, that said above mentioned resolution number 13 be amended as follows:-

First, that on Pleasant Ridge Avenue, to a point 100 feet north of Carlsruh Avenue be changed, so as to meet the best interests of the property owners in that immediate vicinity and the property abutting thereon; and

Council meet in regular session. Meeting called to order by Mayor Chamberlain Roll call. Members present Messrs Leonard Lind Krannamacher & Davies.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

Mr. Krannamacher called for the final reading of the ordinance to accept the plat of the Forest Addition Ordinance #36 (See ordinance book page) after the reading of the ordinance a vote was called for on the passage of the ordinance resulting as follows. Yeas Messrs Leonard, Lind, Krannamacher, Davies. No one.

Mr. Krannamacher then presented the following resolution
Resolution of notification to the Board of Capitol University.
Whereas it becomes necessary to open Cassady Avenue to Main Street, the said street to conform to the plat and Addition known as the Forest Addition to Bexley and therefore requiring 327⁰ feet off the east side of the track of land belonging to the Capitol University in order to give the said Cassady Avenue the proper width at Main Street, the same as delineated on the plat of the Forest Addition, and whereas it is also necessary to open up an alley through this University lot to conform to the aforesaid plat and addition,

Resolution # 26

Be it therefore resolved to send the following notice through the Village clerk to the Board of Capitol University:-

To the Honorable Board of
Capitol University, Bexley Columbus Ohio.
Rev L. H. Berry secy.

Whereas it become necessary to extend Cassady Avenue south to Main Street, the said Cassady Avenue as now established and proposed to be extended to Main Street, passing along and through the east side of the University lot situated north of Main Street in Bexley, the said extension of said Cassady Avenue as proposed requiring a strip of ground three hundred and seventy hundred (327⁰) feet wide along the east side

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of the above said lot; and whereas it will also be necessary to open up a fifteen (15) foot alley running east and west through the middle of the above said lot, you are hereby notified by the Village Council of the Village of Bexley and State of Ohio through its clerk, that you are requested either to dedicate or to deed to the Village of Bexley of the State of Ohio for street purposes an alley fifteen (15) feet wide through the center of this above mentioned lot and running east and west parallel with Main Street, so as to comply with the general plan of the plat of the lots adjoining this lot, and a strip of ground thirty two and seventy hundredths (32.70) feet wide along the east side of the above mentioned lot so as to become a part of the proposed extension of Cassady Avenue running north and south along and through the east side of said University lot; and that you are requested to act in this matter and give us an answer within thirty days after the receipt of this notice.

Passed August 13th 1912.

Mr Lind then presented resolution # 27

Resolution to request the County Commissioners to establish a subway under the Central Ohio railway.

Be it resolved, by the Council of the Village of Bexley, that we hereby respectfully petition the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, to establish a subway crossing under the tracks of the Central Ohio Railway Co., where Parkview Ave, has been opened and dedicated to the right of way lines of the said railroad, for the reason that this will give to the Village of Bexley a through thoroughfare extending from Main St. to Fifth Ave., through our best residence territory.
