Whereas our present tax Levy for the village of Bexley, State of Ohio, is limited by the Smith one per cent law to the 1910 tax, whereby the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio, has not sufficient funds to meet the interest and provide for a sinking fund for the Bond issue voted upon April 15th 1912 at a special election held for that purpose for the purpose of constructing a water and sewer system within the aforesaid Village of Bexley, and whereas it will require two and one fourth ( $2\frac{1}{4}$ ) mills of the assessed valuation of the property of said Village of Bexley for the purpose of meeting the interest of and providing for the sinking fund for the aforesaid Bond issue for the construction of a water and sewer system on certain streets within the said Village of Bexley to be submitted

to a vote of the qualified electors of said Village of Bexley, and

Be it further resolved, that the Mayor of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio, be and hereby is authorized and directed to take the necessary legal steps preparing to submit to a vote of the people of the said Village of Bexley at the coming general election on November 5th, 1912, the proposition of levying said additional tax aforesaid.

This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Council met in regular session. Meeting called to order by Mayor Chamberlain. Roll call members present Messrs Leonard Lind Braumacher Kuehnl & Davies. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

The Mayor reported that the survey of the streets would likely be made this as the surveyors which Mr Connor had agreed to furnish could not be spared before this time. Mr Connor sent suggestion that council furnish the iron pins and a man to place them according to the instructions of the surveyors. The question of securing a man to get the pins and assist the surveyors was referred to the Chairman of the street and alley Com.

Mr Braumacher report on the proposed light at Mrs Reigles that he had consulted Evans Hopkins and that the cost of the light and changing the starting box in the north end would be about \$75<sup>00</sup> cost of light about \$40<sup>00</sup>.

Motion carried that the light Com. investigate the number of lights absolutely necessary and cost of installing same and cost of moving starting box in north end from Columbia Ave to Park View Ave and report at the next meeting.

Mr Leonard reported that some boys were seen shooting at the light on Park View and Main. After some discussion as to what action to take it was decided that the solicitor draft the necessary resolution or ordinance in regard to protecting the light and have the same ready for the next meeting.

Mr Braumacher offered the following motion  
That the Com. appointed by this Council to confer with the City of Cle. to bring about a joint agreement and contract between the City of Cle. and the Village of Bexley for the purpose of constructing with the Village of Bexley a water supply system and sewerage disposal system and connecting the same with the sewerage systems of the city of Cleves, State of Ohio, be now asked to make a report to this Council, and that the report of this Committee be spread on the minutes.

The report showed that the com. was untiring in their efforts to obtain a satisfactory agreement and contract with the Council of Col. and had met with a great deal of objection from different members of the City Council and had at last agreed that it was useless to expect any favorable action at all from Col. and suggested to the Village Council that they take the necessary steps to install a system for sewerage at least independent of the city of Columbus.

After the report motion carried by a full vote to accept the report and extend to the Com. their hearty thanks for the effort they had made to obtain a contract with Columbus.

Mr. Baumeracher then presented, <sup>the following</sup> Resolution.

## Resolution #30

Whereas it appears from the report of the Committee appointed by this Council to confer with the City of Columbus, State of Ohio, to bring about a joint agreement and contract between said City and the Village of Bexley for the purpose of constructing within the Village of Bexley a water supply system and sewage disposal system and connecting the same with the respective systems of the city of Columbus, Ohio, that the City of Columbus is at this time not ready and willing to enter into such a contract and agreement with the Village of Bexley.

Therefore Be it resolved by the Council of the Village of Bexley, state of Ohio, that Ordinance #35 Authorizing and Directing the Mayor and Clerk to sign and execute written contract for water supply and the construction

Whereas the City of Columbus, State of Ohio is not ready and willing at this time to enter into an agreement and written contract with the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio, to take care of said Village's Sewage, thereby making useless plan No. one delineating a sewer system for the Village of Bexley as drawn and planned by the Sanitary Engineer of Said Village, Therefore be it moved

That plan No. two delineating a sewer system for the Village of Bexley and drawn up by the Sanitary engineer of said Village be now substituted for the above plan.

That the former Sanitary Engineer of the Village shall present this plan to the village council for consideration at this meeting of Council.

Mr. Kimberly then presented plan No. 2 to build a trunk line along Alum Creek to a disposal plant at or near Livingston Ave.

After a general discussion the question was referred to the Sewer & Drain Com. for investigation and consideration and report at the next meeting.

Mr. Traunemacher then offered a motion that the Village purchase 4 tons of stone 2 of coarse and 2 of fine for the streets.

Council meet in regular session. Meeting called to order by Mayor or Chamberlain. Roll call. All members present. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

Mr. Brannemacher reported that the surveyor had started work to locate the street corner and would likely take about two more days to complete the work.

Leonard lights reported that they had not been able to get the desired information therefor could not report at this meeting. Motion carried that they continue their investigation and report at the next meeting. The question of the width of walks on Pleasant Ridge Avenue was presented. Council decided to take no further action at present as the walks now being put down were temporary but when the walk was made permanent all would be compelled to pack down 5 foot walk as per Resolution passed and notice served.

Mr. Brannemacher reported that the Treasurer had placed the funds of the Village on interest at 3% daily balance.

Mr. Leonard brought up the question in regard to the money the City of Columbus was expected to pay to the Village on the Authorized annexation of the Morrison addition and the Latimer tract.

Motion carried authorizing the clerk to notify the Treasurer of Columbus of the amount due the Village.

Mr. Brannemacher reported that there would likely be some tax due the Village from the township as they had levied a road tax and had not done any thing on our streets and had also collected the dog license tax but had not paid Bexley her apportion amount would be from \$500.00 to \$800. Also that the question of the township ditch would be brought up at the next meeting of the trustee. The question of offering the Bonds of the Village for sale was brought up for discussion.

The Chairman of the sinking Fund reported that the Trustees were not financially able to take all or any of the bonds therefore the offer was declined with Regret. (See Record Book A Page 10 Sec. Sinking Fund trustee.)

Mr. Link then offered the following (Resolution #31) Whereas, The Trustees of the Sinking Fund did not take any of the bonds issued for the construction of a water system and a sewerage and sewer disposal for the Village of Bexley, Ohio, and whereas the Village of Bexley is not within the city school district to which said bonds may be offered, Therefore, be it resolved to advertise the same for public sale selling the same as provided by law by publishing the same in two newspapers of general circulation in the Village. Carried by a full vote of all members of Council.

Mr. Link then offered the following (Resolution #32) Resolve that the sum of \$200. be paid A. Elliott Kimberly for service rendered in connection of the preparing of plans for the water & sewer systems and sewage disposal to be paid out of the Contingent appropriation in the General Fund and to be replaced from the sale of the bonds.

Voting on the resolution were messrs Leonard Link, Benjamin Davis Brannmacher, Kreebold.

Mr. Brannmacher reported that the sewer and drain com. had held a meeting with Mr. Kimberly and had agreed upon a contract and had requested Mr. Kimberly to have the same prepared in writing and present to Council for acceptance.

Mr. Kimberly then presented his contract.
