

An Ordinance No. 34.

(Against guns, pistols, sky-rockets, squibs, fire crackers, fire balls, balloons and explosives.)

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio, two-thirds of the members elected and appointed thereto concurring therein.

Section 1. That whoever shall throw, cast or let off any sky-rocket, squib, cracker firework, or other explosive charged with gun powder, or other noisy combustible matter, or discharge any common gun, pistol, or other contrivance for the purpose of making a noise upon any highway or public grounds of this village shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before the Mayor or Police Justice shall be fined not less than One nor more than Twenty Dollars or be imprisoned not more than ten days, or both, and pay the costs of arrest and prosecution.

Section 2. That whoever shall build, make, cause or assist the same to be done, any fire or bonfire, or throw any fire ball or other thing saturated with turpentine, gasoline or other highly combustible matter, in any street alley or other public grounds in this village, or cause any balloon or other thing inflated or floated with turpentine, gasoline or other like inflammable spirits to ascend from any part of this village, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof before the Mayor or Police Justice of the village shall be fined in any sum not more than Twenty-five Dollars or be imprisoned not more than ten days, or both.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be and remain in force, from and after its due passage and publication as required by law.
