AN ORDINANCE NO. 36.

Accepting A. W. Forrest and others' "Bexley Park" Subdivision.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio;

SECTION 1. That A. W. Forrest and others' "Bexley Park" Subdivision, being a subdivision of Reserve A., B., and C., and Lots Nos. 1 to 10, both inclusive, 65 feet off the east end of Lots Nos. 11 and 12 and a strip 30 feet wide north and south and 185 feet east and west out of the south-west corner of Lot No. 12, and all of lots Nos. 13 and 14 in Block No. 27 of Bullitt Park Addition as amended, as the same are numbered and delineated on the recorded plat thereof, in Plat Book No. 5, page 382, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio; also Lots Nos. 13 and 14 as shown on the plat marked "Exhibit F," in the case of Belle M. Miller vs. Eliza L. Joyce and others, recorded in Complete Record 96, page 515, etc., Court of Common Pleas, Franklin County, Ohio,--be, and the same is hereby approved and accepted. Streets and alleys shown on the plat thereof, and not heretofore dedicated, are hereby declared public highways of the Village of Bexley.

After the first reading a vote was taken on passing the Ordinance from its first to its second reading at the next meeting. The roll was called resulting as follows: Yeas - Wannemacher, Lind, Kneeland, Davies. Nays - Leonard. Yeas 4. Nays 1.

At a regular meeting of the Village Council of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, held at the regular place of meeting on February 27th, 1912, with all Members present, the following action was taken, as appears on record on Page 126, Volume A., Minute Book of said Council.

Mr. Lind moved to suspend the rules after the second reading, and pass the Ordinance to its third reading by its title, and place it on its passage. The roll was then called on the motion and the rules were suspended by the following vote: Yeas - Wannemacher, Lind, Leonard, Connors, Kneeland, Davies. Nays - None.

The roll was then called on the passage, and the Ordinance was passed by the following vote: Yeas - Wannemacher, Lind, Leonard, Kneeland, Davies, Connors.

Said Ordinance is as follows: (Presented by Louis Lind, Village of Bexley, State of Ohio.)

An Ordinance No. 31, providing for a Water Supply and Sewer Disposal System:

Section 1. Be it Ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio, two-thirds (2/3) of all the Members, elected or appointed thereto, concurring therein, that it is necessary to issue and sell bonds in the fiscal year, beginning January 1st, 1912, for the purpose of furnishing a Water Supply and Sewer Disposal System for the inhabitants of said Village, in an amount greater than 1% of the total value of all property real and personal in the limits of said Village, as listed and assessed for taxation, to-wit, is \$1,813,000.00. And in the opinion of the Village Council, as estimated by the Sanitary Engineer, the sum of \$90,000.00 will be necessary to provide said Water Supply and Sewer Disposal System for said Village, a sum in excess of the authority of the Council to raise by Bond without a vote of the qualified Electors of said Village; that the question of issuing and selling the bonds of said Village, in excess of the amount authorized by the Council in any one Year, or in the aggregate, be submitted to a vote of the qualified voters of said Village at a special election to be held in said Village for that purpose on the 15th day of April, A. D. 1912 at the regular and usual place of voting in said Village; and said special election shall be conducted, canvassed and certified in the same manner as General Municipal elections in said Village.

Section 2. That the Mayor of the Village be, and is hereby directed to give public notice as required by Law, attested by the Village Clerk, of the time and place of holding said Special Election, and that said Village Clerk, be, and is hereby directed to certify a copy of this Ordinance to the Deputy State Supervisor of Franklin County, Ohio, for their information and guidance in preparing ballots for said Special Election herein ordained.

Section 3. That this Ordinance take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by Law, after its passage and publication.

The following action was taken: Mr. Lind presented Ordinance No. 33 to sell Bonds to furnish a Water Supply and Sewer Disposal System, for its third reading. After the third reading a general discussion followed on some parts of the Ordinance, and some other matters that were not fully complete, it was decided not to offer the Ordinance for passage at this meeting.

Motion carried by a full vote of all Members present that further action be postponed until the next meeting.

At an adjourned meeting of the Village Council of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, held May 7th, 1912, at the regular place of meeting, with all Members present, the following action was taken:

Mr. Connors offered a motion that Ordinance No. 33, which had been given three separate readings, be presented for passage. Motion carried by a full vote.

Mr. Lind then presented Ordinance No. 33, to issue Bonds for the purpose of providing a Water Supply and Sewer Disposal System for passage. A vote was then taken, resulting as follows: Yeas - Wannemacher, Lind, Connors, Kneeland, Davies. Nays - Leonard. Yeas 5. Nays 1.

The above Ordinance is as follows:

An Ordinance No. 33, presented by Louis Lind, to issue Bonds for the purpose of providing for Water Supply and Sewer Disposal System:

WHEREAS, at a special election duly authorized and held in the Village of Bexley, Ohio, on the 15th day of April, 1912, held for that purpose, the question of issuing bonds of said Village in an amount in excess of 1% of the total value of all property in said Village, as listed, that is in the sum of \$90,000.00 for the purpose of providing for a Water Supply and Sewer Disposal System, was submitted to a vote of the qualified Electors of said Village of Bexley, Ohio, and,

WHEREAS, two-thirds (2/3) of the voters voting at such election upon the question of issuing said Bonds, voted in favor thereof, now, therefore, be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That Bonds of said Village of Bexley, Ohio, be issued in the sum of \$90,000.00 for the said purpose of providing for a Water Supply and Sewer Disposal System, each of said Bonds to be in the denomination of \$500.00, numbered consecutively from One (1) to One Hundred and Eighty (180), all made payable on the first day of August, A. D. 1912, and bearing interest at the rate of Four and One-half Per Cent. (4 1/2%) per annum, payable semi-annually, on the first day of October and April of each Year, evidenced by coupons attached thereto, and said Bonds shall be dated Bexley, Ohio, August 1st, 1912, and shall run for a period of Thirty (30) Years, and said Bonds and said coupons attached thereto, shall be payable at the Agency of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, in the City of Columbus, Ohio.

Section 2. Said bonds shall express upon their face the purpose for which they were issued, in pursuance of this Ordinance. They shall be prepared, issued and delivered under the direction of the Ways and Means Committee of said Village Council, and said Village Clerk, and shall be signed by the Mayor of said Village, and by said Village Clerk, and sealed with the Corporation Seal of said Village, and interest coupons attached to said bonds shall be executed by said Village Clerk with his signature thereto, or he shall have his signature printed or lithographed thereon. Said bonds shall be registered in the Office of the Trustees of the Sinking Fund of said Village in the name of the purchaser.

Section 3. Said bonds shall be offered at par and accrued interest thereon to the Trustees of the Sinking Fund of said Village of Bexley, in their official capacity, and if the Sinking Fund Trustees of said Village

refuses to take any or all of said Bonds at par and accrued interest, and such bonds as are not taken by said Trustees of the Sinking Fund of said Village, shall be advertised for public sale and sold in the manner provided by Law, but not for less than their par value and accrued interest.

Section 4. The proceeds from the sale of said bonds, except the premiums and accrued interest thereon shall be placed in the Village Treasury of Bexley, Ohio, to the credit of the Water Supply and Sewer Disposal Fund of said Village, and shall be used for the purpose of installing Water Supply and Sewer Disposal System, and for no other purpose, and the premiums and accrued interest from the sale of said bonds shall be transferred to the Trustees of the Sinking Fund of said Village of Bexley, to be applied by them in the manner provided by Law.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by Law, after its passage and publication.
