

AN ORDINANCE NO. 105

TO PROVIDE FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF LEGAL COUNSEL.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley,
State of Ohio, as follows to wit:

SECTION 1. That legal counsel shall be provided for this Village and the person employed as such counsel shall be known as the "Solicitor of the Village of Bexley, Ohio". Such Solicitor shall be employed at the first meeting in January, 1916 for the period of one year; and thereafter at the first meeting of the Council in January annually a person shall be employed as such Solicitor for the ensuing year.

SECTION 2. The Solicitor shall be an attorney at law admitted to practice in the Courts of Ohio. It shall be the duty of said Solicitor to act as attorney and counsel for the Village and the officials thereof in their official capacity, except in matters wherein said Village may be involved in litigation; and, to attend council meetings and render legal opinions to the Council and to any department or officers of the Village upon request in writing.

SECTION 3. The salary of the Solicitor shall be Three
Hundred Dollars per annum, payable monthly, for the services to be rendered as herein provided, excepting for services and advice rendered to the Board of Trustees of Public Affairs, for which service and advice such Solicitor shall receive from said board the additional sum of One Hundred Dollars per annum, payable ~~quarterly~~ ^{monthly}. Said Solicitor shall not be required to render any service to the Village or said Board in any litigated matters for the salary and compensation aforesaid, but, in case his services should be required by said Village or said Board in any case or cases where the Village is involved or is about to be involved in litigation, he shall receive for such service such sum or sums as may be agreed upon by such Solicitor and the Council.

SECTION 4. That all ordinances and resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
