

AN ORDINANCE NO. 153

Declaring it necessary and determining to proceed with the construction of certain sanitary sewers in the Village of Baxley.

BE IT ORDAINED: By the Council of the Village of Baxley, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That it is necessary and it hereby is determined to proceed with the construction of certain sanitary sewers in said village, as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a manhole in Cassady Avenue Ten (10) feet west of the center line thereof and about Forty (40) feet south of Elm Street; thence diagonally across Cassady Avenue to a manhole at or near the intersection of the east line of said Cassady with the center line of Elm Avenue; thence east with the center line of Elm Avenue to a manhole Six (6) feet west of the center line of the alley between Cassady Avenue and Ardmore Road; thence north Six (6) feet west of and parallel with the center line of said alley 1457.2 feet to a manhole Six (6) feet south of the center line of the first alley south of Broad Street; thence west in said first alley south of Broad Street and Six (6) feet south of the center thereof One hundred (100) feet to a flushing manhole; also in said first alley south of Broad Street and Six (6) feet south of the center thereof from the manhole aforesaid, a distance of Nine hundred (900) feet easterly to a flushing manhole.

Section 2. That said sewers shall be constructed of vitrified sewer pipe and in accordance with the plans and specifications on file in the office of the clerk of said Village.

Section 3. That the whole cost of constructing said sewers and any and all necessary expense connected therewith shall be paid by said Village out of the proceeds of the sale

of bonds heretofore authorized to be issued, ~~as~~ ^{as} ~~for~~ and
appropriated for such purpose, ~~as~~ ^{as} ~~for~~ ~~said~~.

Section 4. That the clerk be and hereby is authorized
to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement
according to law.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in
force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
