AN ORDINANCE 458

To fix the location and width and to establish the grade of sidewalks on Main Street Progress the east end of the bridge over Alum Creek and the east corporation who on the Village of Bexley.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the sidewalks on both sides of Main Street between each end of the bridge over Alum Creek and the east corporation line of said values, shall be five (5) feet in width with the inner edge thereof, (that is, the edge farthest from the curb), a distance of nine (9) feet from the face of the stone curb.

SECTION 2. That the grade of said sidewalk shall be what is known as a standard grade, having the inner edge thereof four-tenths (4/10) of a root above the grade of the existing curb and the outer edge on the same grade as the grade of said curb.
