

## Resolution 168. ✓

Whereas the Village of Bexley, Ohio, contains two and half square miles within its corporate limits with a rapid growing population of 1500, with more than 8 miles of paved streets, and with a college of 250 students in the center of the village, which demand not only good mail service, but also a local post office with mail twice a day; and whereas the mail services now being given through the Columbus Post Office is not meeting the wants of the people of Bexley, Ohio, the same being in general unsatisfactory;

And whereas the people of the village of Bexley, Ohio are clamoring for and herewith request an independent post office with rural mail delivery for the college and people calling for their mail at the office; and

Whereas the mail can be carried on the Ohio Electric Ry. from Columbus to Bexley, Ohio, and delivered near the post office,

Therefore be it resolved by the Council of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, that Council of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, petition request and urge upon the Post Office Department at Washington D. C. to establish at an early date an independent post office within the village of Bexley, Ohio, giving the people of Bexley a rural delivery once a day during the week and a mail in the afternoon to be delivered at the general delivery window of the office, Sundays excepted.
