

An Ordinance No. 176

TO FIX THE SALARY OF THE CLERK OF THE BOARD OF  
TRUSTEES OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY?

STATE OF OHIO, TO-WIT:

SECTION 1. That the salary of the Clerk of the Board  
Trustees of Public Affairs of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, hereby  
fixed at the sum of \$600 per year, payable monthly from and after the  
first day of January, 1918.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect <sup>and be in force</sup> from and after  
the earliest period allowed by law.
