RESOLUTION NO. 22.
 By Mr. Thos. Hatfield:
 Declaring it necessary to construct a part of the sanitary sewer shown in the plan of Sewer District No. 4.
 Be it resolved, By the council of the village of Bexley, Ohio:
 That it is necessary to construct a certain part of the sanitary sewers in Sewer District No. 4, hereinafter described, provided for in an amended plan of said sewer districts in said village, which amended plan was duly adopted by the council on the 15th day of March, 1921, and is now on file in the office of the clerk of said village:
 That the portion of the work provided for in said plan hereby determined to be constructed is as follows:
 Commencing in Euclaire Avenue 20 feet south of the south line of Charles Street; thence south in Euclaire Avenue to Livingston Avenue; thence west along the north line of Livingston Avenue to a point where said sewer will connect with the main trunk sewer in said Livingston Avenue.
 Be it further resolved that sewers shall be constructed in accordance with the plans, profiles and specifications on file in the office of the clerk of said village, and shall be of vitrified sewer pipe.
 Be it further resolved that the whole cost of said improvement, less one-fiftieth thereof, shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All the lots and lands fronting and abutting upon Euclaire Avenue, between Charles Street and Livingston Avenue, and on the north side of Livingston Avenue, from Euclaire Avenue west to the main trunk sewer, which said lots are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement.
 Be it further resolved that assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five annual installments, with interest on deferred payments at the rate of six per cent per annum.
 Be it resolved further that bonds of the village of Bexley shall be issued in anticipation of the collection by installments and in an amount equal thereto.
 Be it further resolved that the remainder of the cost of said improvement, not specially assessed, shall be paid out of the sewer fund of said village.
 Be it further resolved that the clerk of said village is hereby directed to cause this resolution to be published for not less than two weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in said village.
