

Resolution No 1

Declaring it necessary to construct that part of sewers shown upon the plan of sewer district No 3 hereinafter described.

Whereas, the owners of more than three-fourths in interest of the lots and lands and parcels of ground fronting and abutting upon the line of sanitary sewer hereinafter described and situated in Sanitary Sewer District No 3 of the Village of Buxley, Wis. have filed with the Council of the said village their written petition asking for the construction of said sanitary sewer and consenting that the entire cost of constructing said sewer together with one-half of the cost of constructing any sewer or sewer necessary to be constructed in Passady Avenue be assessed upon their said lots and lands and collected without reference to the value of the property of the subscribers.

Now therefore be it resolved by the Council of the Village of Buxley State of Wis. to-wit: That it is necessary to construct that part of the sewer hereinafter described and provided for on the plan of a system of sanitary sewers in said village, known as Sewer District No 3 adopted by the council on Sep. 11th day of June, 1918 and now on file in the office of the clerk of said village and that the portion of the work provided for in said general plan, which it is hereby determined to construct be as follows.

A ten inch sewer commencing at the intersection of Maryland Avenue and Walnut Street, thence easterly to connect with the main sanitary sewer for said district at the intersection of Stanbery Avenue and Maryland Avenue, thence easterly in Maryland Avenue to Passady Avenue, thence north in Passady Avenue to a point about one foot north of the south line of Bellwood Addition to said village, thence easterly upon a private right of way through lot No 640 of said addition to the first alley in said addition east of Passady Avenue, an eight inch sewer in the first alley east of Passady Avenue in said addition from about the center of the first alley south of Columbus Avenue in said addition a point about 20 feet south of the north line of lot 463 of said addition; and eight inch sewer in the first alley south of said Columbus Avenue from the first alley east of said Passady Avenue to Spruce Street; an eight inch sewer in the first alley north of said Columbus Avenue from the first alley east of said Passady Avenue to Spruce Street; an eight inch sewer in the first alley north of Bellwood Avenue in said addition from the first alley east of Passady Avenue to Spruce Street; an eight inch sewer in the first alley north of Allegheny Avenue in said addition from the first alley east of Passady Avenue to Spruce Street; an eight inch sewer in Walnut Street from said

Maryland Avenue to a joint at about the center line of
Park Avenue in Bexley Heights addition; an eight inch
sewer in said Park Avenue from the first alley east of
Dawson Avenue in said Bexley Heights Addition to the first
alley west of said Walnut Street; an eight inch sewer in said
first alley east of said Dawson Avenue from Park Avenue to
a joint about twenty feet south of the north line of lot 136 of said
Bexley Heights Addition; an eight inch sewer in the first alley west
of said Dawson Avenue from Park Avenue to a joint about
twenty feet south of the north line of lot 91 of said Bexley
Heights Addition; and an eight inch sewer in the first alley
west of said Walnut Street to a joint about twenty feet south of the
north line of lot number 47 of said Bexley Heights addition.

Be it resolved further that said sewer shall be constructed in
accordance with plan and specifications filed in the office
of the clerk of said village and shall be completed by
17th day of January

Be it resolved further, that the whole cost of
said improvements shall be assessed in proportion
to the benefits which may result from said improve-
ments, upon the following described lots and lands
to-wit: All of the lots and lands fronting, bound-
ing and abutting upon the lines of the proposed
sewers, which said lots and lands are hereby
determined to be specially benefited by said
improvements.

Be it Resolved Further, That the assessments
so to be levied shall be paid in five annual in-
stallments with interest thereon at the rate of six
per cent (6%) per annum; provided that the
owner of any property assessed may, at his option
pay such assessments in cash within thirty
days from the levy thereof upon due notice being
given.

Be it Resolved Further, That bonds or notes of
the village of Bexley shall be issued in anticipation
of the levy of special assessments and in an amount
sufficient to pay the estimated cost of said sewers.

Be it Resolved Further, That the clerk be and hereby
is directed to cause this resolution to be published
for not less than two consecutive weeks in one
news paper of general circulation, in the village
