

Ordinance # 287

To prevent the keeping of swine and other animals to the annoyance and discomfort of the public.

Be it ordained by the Council of the village of Bexley, state of Ohio:

Section 1. That it shall be and hereby is declared to be unlawful for any person or persons to keep any swine or other animals in pens or otherwise within the corporate limits of the village of Bexley, Ohio; the keeping of which produces offensive and unwholesome odors, to the injury or annoyance of the public, and constitutes a public nuisance.

Section 2. That any person or persons violating the provisions of Section One of this ordinance shall upon conviction be fined for the first offense not less than five nor more than fifty dollars and for each subsequent offense not less than ten nor more than one hundred dollars and that each day such nuisance is continued shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
