

Ordinance #307
By Mr. Thos. Hatfield,

To fix the salaries, compensation and bonds of Village officials and employees up to and including ordinances Nos. 276, 273, and 260 adopted November 25, 1919, May 25, 1920 and September 14, 1920 respectively.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio, as follows, to-wit:

Section 1 That the salary of the Mayor of the Village shall be \$100⁰⁰ dollars per annum, in addition to the fees and other compensation now or hereafter provided by law, and he shall give bond in the sum of five hundred dollars.

Section 2 That the salary of the Clerk shall be \$600⁰⁰ dollars per annum and the compensation of a deputy clerk shall be \$3⁰⁰ dollars per month and each shall give bond in the sum of five hundred dollars.

Section 3 That the salary of the Treasurer shall be \$100⁰⁰ dollars per annum, and he shall give bond in the sum of \$500⁰⁰ dollars.

Section 4 That the salary of the Solicitor shall be \$300⁰⁰ dollars per annum for all services rendered as attorney and counsel for the Village and the officials thereof in their official capacity provided however, said solicitor shall not be required to render any service to said Village or officials in any litigated matter for the salary and compensation aforesaid, but in case his services shall be required by said Village or officials in any case or cases wherein the Village is involved or about to be involved in litigation he shall receive for such services such sum or sums as may be agreed upon by such solicitor and the Council.

The Solicitor shall give bond in the sum of five hundred dollars.

Section 5 The salary of the Assessor shall be in the sum of Fifty (\$50⁰⁰) dollars per annum in addition to such fees as are allowed by law, and he shall give bond in the sum of \$50⁰⁰ dollars.

Section 6 The salary of the Street Commissioner of the Village shall be Seventeen hundred dollars (\$1700⁰⁰) per annum. That the compensation of one assistant shall be One hundred dollars (\$100⁰⁰) per month, which continuously employed, the compensation of laborers shall be not to exceed sixty five cents per hour and the compensation for each team and driver employed by said Street Commissioner shall be not to exceed ninety cents per hour. Said Street Commissioner shall give bond in the sum of \$500⁰⁰ dollars.

- Section 7 There shall be a clerk of the Trustees of the Sinking Fund and his salary shall be Three hundred and sixty dollars (\$360) per annum, he shall give bond in the sum of \$5000 - collect, as provided by law.
- Section 8 The salary of the Clerk of the Board of Trustees of Public Affairs shall be One thousand dollars (\$1000) per annum, and he shall give bond in the sum of 1000⁰⁰ dollars.
- Section 9 The compensation of each member of the Village Council shall be two dollars for each and every meeting of the Council held whether the same be a regular, adjourned or called meeting, provided said meetings shall not exceed twenty four in any year, and provided further that no member of the Council shall receive any compensation whatever for any meeting of the Council which he or she does not attend, and answers to his name on roll call as shown by the minutes of the Clerk.
- Section 10 That the salaries and compensation of each of the above named officers and members of the Council of the Village shall be paid quarterly except the salaries of the Clerk, Deputy Clerk, Clerk of the Board of Trustees of Public Affairs, Clerk of the Trustees of the Sinking Fund, Street Commissioner, Assistant to the Street Commissioner and collector which shall be paid monthly out of the Village Treasury after the same has become due and the Clerk and Treasurer are duly authorized and directed to pay said salaries and compensation when due as herein provided, without other action of the Council thereon.
- Section 11 That ordinances number 246-243 and 260 heretofore passed on November 25, 1919, May 25, 1920, and September 04, 1920 respectively, and all other ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.
- Section 12 That the ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law after its passage.
