

Ordinance No. 309

To vacate Easement to property located immediately West of Bexley Drive from Livingston Avenue to York Avenue.

Whereas, there was executed, and submitted to this Council a Plat of an Addition known as Bexley Drive Subdivision No. 3, and Council accepted said Plat and the same has been duly filed and recorded in Plat Book No. 14, page 29 of record in the Recorder's Office Franklin County, Ohio, and

Whereas, there is written on said Plat two dotted lines representing a strip of ground ten feet wide, running through the property immediately west of Bexley Drive and extending from Livingston Avenue to York Avenue, within which dotted lines is marked the word "Easement," and

Whereas, it is the sense of this body that the execution, acceptance and filing of said Plat showing said dotted lines marked "Easement," does not convey any right, title, interest or easement in said strip of land to the public or the Village of Bexley, and that the same is of no force or effect whatsoever, and

Whereas, Council is of the opinion that there is also good cause for vacating said "Easement" if the public or the Village of Bexley have any right therein, and that such vacation will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made, now therefore.

Be it resolved, by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio,

Sec. 1.

That any and all right, title, interest or easement which the public or the Village of Bexley might have in said strip of ground immediately West of Bexley Drive and extending from Livingston Avenue to York Avenue, by reason of said Plat being so executed, accepted, and filed, be and the same hereby is vacated.

Sec. 2.

That this ordinance be and remain in force from and after the earliest period

allowed by law.
