

Resolution No. 264. /

Declaring it necessary to improve Ardmore Road from Elm Avenue to the first alley south of Broad Street by the construction of a water line therein.

Whereas the owners of three-fourths or more in interest of the property fronting and abutting on Ardmore Road between Elm Avenue and the first alley south of Broad Street in the village of Bexley, Ohio, have filed their written petition with the council of said village, praying said council to pass the necessary legislation therefor and to improve said Ardmore Road between said points by constructing therein a six inch (6") water main with necessary fire hydrants, and consenting that the entire cost thereof shall be assessed by the foot frontage upon the lots and lands fronting and abutting upon said Ardmore Road between the points aforesaid, and collected in equal annual installments in such manner and within such period as may be fixed by said council, and

Whereas said petitioners in said petition did expressly waive all benefits of the privileges of Section 3819 of the General Code, limiting the aggregate amount of all assessments that may be levied upon their property within five years, and also did expressly waive the benefits of the provisions of Sections 3814, 3818 and 3895, providing for the service and publication of notice of the proceedings for the construction of said water line, and the making and levying of the assessments therefor, and

Whereas said petitioners also in their petition consented and agreed that the cost of constructing said water line, to be assessed as aforesaid, shall include the cost of constructing an eight inch (8") water line in Powell Avenue from Cassady Avenue to Ardmore Road to tie in the line to be constructed in Ardmore Road with an eight (8") inch line heretofore constructed in Cassady Avenue.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That it is necessary to improve said Ardmore Road in said village from Elm Avenue to the first alley south of Broad Street, by constructing therein a six inch (6") water line with necessary

fire hydrants, together with an eight inch (8") water line in Powell Avenue from Cassady Avenue to Ardmore Road, to tie in the line to be constructed in Ardmore Road with a line heretofore constructed in Cassady Avenue, in accordance with the plans, specifications, profiles and estimates of said proposed improvement prepared by the engineers of said village, which plans, specifications, profiles and estimates are hereby approved and are now on file with the clerk of said village.

Section 2. That the grade of said avenue as improved in accordance with this resolution shall be the existing grade.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement shall be assessed by the foot frontage upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit:

All of the lots and lands fronting and abutting upon said proposed improvement, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement in an amount equal to the cost thereof.

Section 4. That the Assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five equal annual installments with interest on deferred payments at a rate not exceeding six per centum (6%) per annum.

Section 5. That bonds of said village shall be issued in anticipation of the levy and the collection of assessments by installments, and in an amount equal thereto.

Section 6. This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
