## RESCLUTION NO. 275.

Declaring it necessary to improve Columbia Avenue from Caroline Avenue to right of way of the B. & O. Railroad Corpany by constructing a water line therein and to repeal Resolution No. 252 adopted Oct. 11, 1921.

whereas all of the owners of the lots and lands fronting and abutting upon said alley have filed their written petition with the council of them.

Village of Berley, Chio, requesting said council to pass the necessary legislation therefor and to improve said alley by constructing therein a water line; and consenting that the cost thereof may be assessed upon their said lots and lands, and collected, in such manner as may be fixed by the council, and

MERREAS said petitioners also consented and agreed that said assessments ments might be levied and collected without reference to value of their said property and waived all benefits of the statute limiting such assessments to thirty—three and one-third (33 1/3) per cent. of the actual value of the property assessed within the period of five years; and also waived the benefits of the provisions of Sections 3814, 3818 and 3895 of the General Code providing for the giving and publication of notice of the proceedings for the construction of said imprevement and the making or levying of the assessments therefor, NOW THEREFORE

BE IT RESCLVED by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Chio. to-wit:

Section 1. That it is necessary to improve Columbia Avenue from the center line of Caroline Avenue to the center line of Delmar Avenue in Bexley Heights Addition to said village by constructing a six inch water line therein, with necessary fire hydrants together with a four inch line therefrom, in Delmar Avenue to tie in with a line constructed in the first alley wast of Parkview Avenue in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles for said proposed improvement, prepared by the engineers of said village, which plans, etc. are hereby approved and are now on file in the office of the clerk of said village.

Section 2. That the grade of said water line as constructed shall be the grade shown on the plans and profiles prepared by the engineers as aforesaid.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement upon the following lots and lands to-with Lots fourteen (14), fifteen (15), sixteen (16), seventeen (17), thirty-four (34), thirty-five (35), thirty-six (36), thirty-seven (37), and thirty-eight (38) of Bexley Heights Addition to said

village, which lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement.

Section 4. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in cash to the village treasurer within ten days after notice of the passage of the ordinance levying the assessment, and in default of such payment the assessments shall be forthwith certified to the tax duplicate for collection as other taxes with interest at 6% and penalties as provided by law.

Section 5. That said assessments when collected shall be used by the treasurer of the village to reimburse the water fund of said village for money expended therefrom, in the sum of \$ which is hereby temporarily appropriated from said fund to pay the cost of said improvement.

Section 6. That resolution No. 252, adopted October 11, 1921, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 7. This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
