

RESOLUTION NO. 264. ✓

Declaring it necessary to construct that part of the sewers shown on the plan of Sewer District No. 3, hereinafter described.

WHEREAS, the owners of more than three-fourths in interest on the lots and lands fronting and abutting upon the first alley east of Cassady Avenue between Broad Street and Maryland Avenue, in the Village of Bexley, and situated in Sanitary sewer District No. 3 of said village have filed with the council their written petition to take the necessary steps therefor, and to construct that part of the sanitary sewer shown on the plan of Sewer District No. 3, in the first alley east of Cassady Avenue between the points aforesaid for the purpose of furnishing sanitary sewerage to the lots and lands fronting and abutting thereon; and consenting that the entire cost of constructing said sewer may be assessed upon their said lots and lands in proportion to the whole assessment, and collected in such manner as may be fixed by Council; and

WHEREAS, said petitioners and each of them did consent and request that said assessments be levied and collected without reference to the value of the property of the subscribers to said petition, and did waive all benefits of the statute limiting assessments to thirty-three and one-third (33 1/3%) per cent. of the actual value of the property assessed, and also waive the benefit of the provisions of sections 3814, 3818 and 3895 of the General Code, providing for the giving and publication of notice of the proceedings for the construction of said sewer and the making and levying of the assessments therefor.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio, to-wit:

SECTION 1. That it is necessary to construct that part of the sewers hereinafter described and provided for on the plan for a system of sanitary sewers in said village, known as Sanitary Sewer District No. 3, adopted by the council on the 11th day of June, 1918, and now on file in the office of the clerk of said village; and that part of the work provided for in said general plan, which it is hereby determined to construct is as follows:

An eight inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassady Avenue of said village between Broad Street and Maryland Avenue.

Section 2. That said sewer shall be constructed of vitrified pipe with brick man-holes and iron covers, in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor, on file in the office of the clerk of said village.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement shall be assessed by the foot front upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit:

All the lots and lands fronting, bounding and abutting upon said first alley east of Cassady Avenue between Broad Street and Maryland Avenue, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be especially benefitted by said improvement, and in amount equal to the cost thereof.

Section 4. That the assessments as to be levied shall be paid in five annual installments with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent. (6%) per annum, payable semi-annually; provided, however, if the bonds of said village issued in anticipation of the levy of said special assessments and such bonds shall bear a rate of interest less than six per cent. (6%) per annum, then such deferred payments shall bear the same rate of interest as is borne by such bonds.

Section 5. That bonds of said village shall be issued in anticipation of the levy of such special assessments and in an amount sufficient to pay the estimated costs of said sewers.

Section 6. That the clerk of said village be and he is hereby directed to cause this resolution to be published in the manner provided by law.

Now, therefore, Be it resolved by the council of the village of Bexley, state of Ohio, to-wit:

Section 1. That it is necessary to construct that part of the sewers hereinafter described and provided for on the plan for a system of sanitary sewers in said village, known as Sanitary Sewer District No. 3, adopted by the 11th day of June, 1921, on file in the office of said village; and that work provided for in said plan which it is hereby determined is as follows:
