that said assessments be levied and collected without reference to the value of the property of the subscribers to said petition, and did waive all benefits of the statute limiting assessments to thirty-three and one-third (55 1/3%) per cent. of the actual value of the property assessed, and also waive the benefit of the provisions of sections 5814, 3818 and 5895 of the General Code, providing for the giving and publication of notice of the proceedings for the construction of said sewer and the making and levying of the assessments therefor.

FOR THEREFORE, be it resolved by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Galo, to-wit:

Section 4. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five annual installments with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent. (6%) per minm, payable semi-ammally; provided, however, if the bonds of said village issued in satisfipation of the levy of said special assessments and such bends shall beer a rate of interest less than six per cent. (6%) per summe, them such deferred payments shall bear the same rate of interest as is borne by such bonds.
