

## A RESOLUTION NO. 304. /

By Mr. Phelps.

Declaring it necessary to construct that part of the sanitary sewers shown on the plan of Sewer District No. 3, hereinafter described and to repeal a resolution entitled "Resolution No. 284 declaring it necessary to construct that part of the sewers shown on the plan of Sewer District No. 3, hereinafter described," adopted May 23, 1922.

BE IT RESOLVED by the council of the village of Bexley, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That it is necessary to construct that part of the sanitary sewers shown on the plan for a system of sewerage in said village, designated as Sanitary Sewer District No. 3, adopted by the council of said village on the 11th day of June, 1918, and now on file in the office of the village clerk; the part of the work provided for in said plan, <sup>which is hereby determined to construct, is</sup> which it is hereby determined to construct, is as follows, to-wit:

An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassady Avenue from the first alley north of Broad Street to Maryland Avenue; an eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Ardmore Road from the first alley north of Broad Street to Maryland Avenue; an eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassingham Road from the first alley north of Broad Street to Maryland Avenue, and an eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley north of Broad Street from Remington Road to Cassady Avenue.

Section 2. That said sewer shall be constructed of vitrified pipe with brick manholes and iron covers, in accordance with the plans, profiles, estimates and specifications therefor, duly approved and on file in the office of the village clerk.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result therefrom upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit:

All of the lots and lands in said village within the territory bounded on the south by Broad Street, on the east by Remington Road, on the north by Maryland Avenue, and on the west by Cassady Avenue, except such as already have adequate sewerage.

Section 4. That the assessments so to be levied shall be payable in five (5) equal annual installments, with interest on the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of said assessments.

Section 5. That bonds of said village shall be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of said assessments by installments, and in an amount sufficient to pay the estimated cost of constructing said sewers.

Section 6. That said Resolution No. 282, adopted May 23, 1922,



declaring it necessary to construct an eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassady Avenue from Broad Street to Maryland Avenue be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 7. This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Be it resolved by the council of the village of Bexley, State of Ohio: Section 1: That it is necessary to construct that part of the sanitary sewers shown on the plan for a system of sewerage in said village, designated as Sanitary Sewer District No. 3, adopted by the council of said village on the 11th day of June, 1918, and now on file in the office of the village clerk; the part of the work provided for in said plan, which it is hereby determined to construct is as follows, to-wit:

An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassady Ave. from the first alley north of Broad St. to Maryland Ave.; an eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Ardmore Rd. from the first alley north of Broad St. to Maryland Ave.; an eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassingham Rd. from the first alley north of Broad St. to Maryland Ave., and an eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley north of Broad St. from Remington Rd. to Cassady Ave.

Sec. 2: That said sewer shall be constructed of vitrified pipe with brick manholes and iron covers, in accordance with the plans, profiles, estimates and specifications therefor, duly approved and on file in the office of the village clerk.

Sec. 3: That the whole cost of said improvement shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result therefrom upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit:

All of the lots and lands in said village within the territory, bounded on the south by Broad St., on the east by Remington Rd., on the north by Maryland Ave., and on the west by Cassady Ave., except such as already have adequate sewerage.

Sec. 4: That the assessments so to be levied shall be payable in five (5) equal annual installments, with interest on deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of said assessments.

Sec. 5: That bonds of said village shall be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of said assessments by installments, and in an amount sufficient to pay the estimated cost of constructing said sewers.

Sec. 6: That said Resolution No. 284, adopted May 23, 1922, declaring it necessary to construct an eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassady Ave. from Broad St. to Maryland Ave. be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 7: This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
