## RESOLUTION NO. 309 /

Declaring it necessary to improve Ardmore Read from Bread Street north to the north line of lots 705 and 782 of Ardmore Addition No. 2 by paving.

WHEREAS the owners of more than three-fourths [3] in interest of the preparty fronting and abutting on Ardmere Read between Bread Street and the north line of lots 705 and 782 of Ardmere Addition No. 2, have filed with the council of the Village of Bexley, their written petition in the words and figures following to-wit:

We, the undersigned, being the owners of the number of feet of property set apposite our names below, and being three-fourths, or more, ininterest of the property abutting upon Ardmore Read between Broad street and the north line of lots Nos. 705 and 782 of Ardmere Addition No. 2, said let lines being the south line of Maryland Avenue extended eastwardly in the Village of Bexley, Chie, respectfully petition the honorable Council to pass the necessary legislation therefor and to improve said Ardmore Road between the points above named, by grading, curbing and paving the readway with brick, asphalt, bitulithic, tarvia, concrete or some other form of permanent improvement. constructing the necessary storm sewers to furnish proper drainage for such improvement, constructing a six inch water line in said road between the points aforesaid with necessary fire hydrants and making water connections therefrom to the lots and lands fronting and abutting upon said road; and consent that the entire cost of said improvement, except only such portion thereof as is by law chargeable against the village, may be assessed and collected in equal annual installments in proportion to the whole assessment in the manner which may be fixed by the Council.

And the undersigned, and each of them, consent and request that said assessments be levied and collected without reference to the value of the property of the subscribers herete and waive all benefits of the provisions of Section 3819 of the General Code limiting assessments to thirty-three and one-third per cent. of the value of the property assessed for any and all purposes within the period of five years; and use waive all benefits of the provisions of Sections 3814, 3818 and 3895 of the General Code providing for the service and publication of notice of the proceedings for the construction of said improvement and the making and levying of the assessments therefor.

NOW THEREFORE? BE IT RESOLVED by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Chie:

Broad Street to the north line of, lots 705 and 782 of Ardmere Addition No. 2, in said village, by grading, curbing and paving the readway with brick, asphalt, bitulithic, tarvia, concrete or some other form of permanent improvement, constructing the necessary storm sewers to furnish proper drainage for such improvement, constructing a six inch water line in said read between the points aforesaid, with necessary fire hydrants and making water connections therefrom to the lots and lands fronting and abutting thereon, in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles of the proposed improvement prepared by the engineers of said village

and now on file in the office of the village clerk, which plans, specifications, estimates and profiles hereby are approved.

Section 2. That the grade of said read as improved shall be, the grade shown by and upen the plans and profiles aforesaid, and the grade of the curbs shall be as fellows, to-wit:

> East and West Curbs. Beginning at the north property line of Bread Street, Station 0 +00 and elevation 117.50; thence northerly with a 0.33% ascending grade to Station 10 + 00, elevation 120.80; thence northerly with a 0.20% ascending grade to the south property line of Maryland Avenue Station 22 7-87, elevation 123.40.

Vertical curves to be used at charge in grade.

Above elevations refer to Village Datum.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement, less one-fiftieth (1/50) thereof, and the cost of intersections shall be assessed by the front foot upon the following described lots and lands to-wit: All of the lots and lands bounding, fronting and abutting upon said proposed improvement, which said lots and lands hereby are determined to be specially benefited by said improvement and in an amount equal to that part of the cost thereof hereby determined to be assessed thereon.

Section 4. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in not less than nine (9) or more than ten (10) equal annual installments, with interest on the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bends te be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection thereof.

Section 5. That bonds of said village of Bexley shall be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of assessments by installments. and in an amount sufficient to pay that portion of the estimated cost of the improvement for which the assessments are to be levied.

Section 6. That the remainder of the cost of said improvement shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds of said village, to be issued in the manner provided by law.

Section 7. This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Section 4. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in not less than nine (9) or more than ten (10) equal annual installments, with interest on the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bends to be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection thereof.

Section 5. That bonds of said village of Bexley shall be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of assessments by installments, and in an amount sufficient to pay that portion of the estimated cost of the imprevement for which the assessments are to be levied.

Section 6. That the remainder of the cost of said improvement shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds of said village, to be issued in the manner provided by law.

Section 7. This resolution shall take effect and be in ferce from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
