

An Ordinance No. 317.

Determining to proceed with the construction of the sewers in a part of sewer district No. 3 hereinafter described.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the construction of the sewers in that part of sewer district No. 3 of said village, described as follows:

A ten inch sewer commencing at the intersection of Maryland Avenue and Walnut Street, thence easterly to connect with the main sanitary sewer for said district at the intersection of Stanbery Avenue and Maryland Avenue; thence easterly in Maryland Avenue to Cassady Avenue; thence north in Cassady Avenue to a point about one foot north of the south line of Bellwood Addition to said village; thence easterly upon a private right of way through lot No. 640 of said addition to the first alley in said addition east of Cassady Avenue; an eight inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassady Avenue in said addition from about the center of the first alley south of Columbus Avenue in said addition a point about 20 feet south of the north line of lot 463 of said addition; an eight inch sewer in the first alley south of said Columbus Avenue from the first alley east of said Cassady Avenue to Spruce Street; an eight inch sewer in the first alley north of said Columbus Avenue from the first alley east of said Cassady Avenue to Spruce Street; an eight inch sewer in the first alley north of Bellwood Avenue in said addition from the first alley east of Cassady Avenue to Spruce Street; an eight inch sewer in the first alley north of Allegheny Avenue in said addition from the first alley east of Cassady Avenue to Spruce Street; an eight inch sewer in Walnut Street from said Maryland Avenue to a point at about the center line of Caroline Avenue in Bexley Heights Addition; an eight inch sewer in said Caroline Avenue from the first alley east of Dawson Avenue in said Bexley Heights Addition to the first alley west of Walnut Street; an eight inch sewer in said first alley east of said Dawson Avenue from Caroline Avenue to a point about 20 feet south of the north line of lot 136 of said Bexley Heights Addition; an eight inch sewer in the first alley west of said Dawson Avenue from Caroline Avenue to a point about twenty feet south of the north line of lot 91 of said Bexley Heights Addition; and an eight inch sewer in the first alley west of said Walnut Street to a point about twenty feet south of the north line of lot number 47 of said Bexley Heights Addition,

pursuant to a resolution declaring the construction of such sewers to be necessary, adopted December 15th, 1921, and in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore prepared by the engineers of said village for a system of sanitary sewerage in said district adopted by the council

on the 11th day of June, 1918, and now on file in the office of the clerk of said village, said sewers shall be constructed of vitrified sewer pipe, and the man holes thereto shall be constructed of brick with iron tops.

Section 2. That the whole cost of constructing said sewers shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement, upon the following described lots and lands to-wit: all of the lots and lands fronting, bounding and abutting the lines of proposed sewers, respectively, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said sewers, and in an amount equal to the cost thereof.

Section 3. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five equal annual installments, with interest on deferred payments at six per cent. (6%) per annum payable semi-annually; provided, however, if bonds or notes of said village are issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of said special assessments, and such bonds or notes bear a rate of interest less than six per cent. (6%) per annum, then such deferred payments shall bear the same rate of interest as is borne by such bonds or notes.

Section 4. That the clerk of said village be and hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction of said sewers according to law.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
