## An Ordinanse No. 529.

Determining to proceed with the improvement of Ardmore Road from Elm Avenue to the first alley south of Bread Street by the egustraction of a water line thereim.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of

Chi.o:

section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Ardmore Road in said village from Elm Avenue to the first elley south of Breed Street, by constructing therein a six inch (6) water lime with necessary hydrants, together with an eight inch (8) water line in Powell Avenue from Cassady Avenue to Ardmore Road, to tie in the line to be constructed in Ardmore Road with a line heretofore constructed in Cassady Avenue, in pursuance of the resolution declaring it necessary to improve said road, adopted Pebruary 14, 1922, and in accordance with plans, specifications, estimates and profiles for said improvement heretofore approved and now on file in the office of the village clerk.

Section 2. That all claims for damage resulting therefrom shall be judicially inquired into after the completion of the proposed improvement, and that the solicitor be and he hereby is sutherized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That the whole sest of said improvement less onefiftieth (1/50) thereof shall be assessed by the front foot, upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All of the lots and lands fronting upon saids proposed improvement which lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement, and in the amount hereby determined to be specially assessed thereon.

Section 4. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five equal summal installments with interest upon the deferred payment at the rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be issued in satisfaction of the levy and of the collection of such assessments.

Section 5. That bonds of said village shall be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of assessments by installments, and in an amount sufficient to pay that portion of the estimated cost of said improvement for which the special assessments are to be levied.

Section 6. That the remainder of the cost of said improvement skall be paid from the proceeds of bonds issued by said village in the manner provided

by law, or out of the water fund of said village.

Section 7. That the clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement according to law.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
