Am ordinance No. 344.

By Mr. Dunlop.

Determining to proceed with the improvement of Peck Avenue, between Main Street and the south line of Astor Avenue.

Be it ordained by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Chio:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Peck Avenue between Main Street and the south line of Astor Avenue in Rider's Addition to said village, by grading, curbing and paving the readway with brick, asphalt, bitulithic, tarvia, or some other form of permanent improvement, constructing the necessary storm sewers to furnish proper drainage for such improvement, constructing a six inch water line with necessary fire hydrants in said avenue between the points aforesaid, and making water connections therefrom to the lots and lands fronting and abutting thereon, in pursuance of a resolution No. 283, declaring it necessary to improve said avenue adopted May 23rd, 1922, and in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles for said improvement, heretofore prepared and on file in the office of the village clerk.

Section 2. That all claims for damages resulting from said improvement, shall be judicially inquired into after the completion of the proposed improvement, and the Solicitor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement less one-fiftieth (1/50) thereof and the cost of intersections shall be assessed by the front foot upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit:

All lots and lands fronting, bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement, and hots and lands hereby are determined to be specially benefitted by said improvement and in an amount hereby determined to be specially assessed thereon.

Section 4. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in not less than nine (9) or more than (10) equal annual installments with interest upon the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of such assessments.

Section 5. That bonds of said village shall be issued in antici-

pation of the levy and of the collection of assessments by installments and in an amount sufficient to pay that portion of the estimated cost of said improvement for which the special assessments are to be levied.

Section 6. That the remainder of the cost of said improvement shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds issued by said village in the manner provided by law.

Section 7. That the clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement according to law.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law. Passed June 6, 1922.
