

## AN ORDINANCE NO. 346.

To provide for the amendment of ordinance No. 339 for the appointment of a Deputy Marshall for the Village of Bexley, passed April, 26, 1922, to read as follows:

Be it ordained by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That the office of Deputy Marshall of said village be and hereby is created and established; that the mayor, subject to confirmation by council, be and hereby is empowered to appoint annually a suitable person as Deputy Marshall of said village, for such period of time as the Mayor may determine to be necessary; that the salary of such Deputy Marshall shall be \$150.00 per month while so acting; and that such Deputy Marshall shall give bond according to law in the sum of \$500.00.

Section 2. That ordinance No. 339, passed April 26, 1922, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
