

## AN ORDINANCE NO. 347.

Determining to proceed with the improvement of Cassingham Road from Broad Street to the north line of lots 627 and 704 of Ardmore Addition No. 2.

Be it ordained by the council of the Village of Bexley,  
State of Ohio;

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Cassingham Road from Broad Street to the north line of lots 627 and 704 of Ardmore Addition No. 2 by grading, curbing and paving the roadway with brick, asphalt, bitulithic, tarvia, concrete or some other ~~constituting it from some material to furnish proper drainage for such improvement~~ form of permanent improvement, constructing a six inch water line with necessary fire hydrants, and making water connections from the water line in said Road to the lots and lands fronting and abutting thereon, in pursuance of the <sup>& v/v</sup> resolution declaring it necessary to improve said Road, adopted 26 day of April, 1922, and in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles for said improvement, heretofore approved and now on file in the office of the village clerk.

Section 2. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom shall be judicially inquired into after the completion of the proposed improvement, and that the solicitor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement less one-fiftieth (1/50) thereof and the cost of intersections shall be assessed by the front foot upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit:

All lots and lands fronting, bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement, which said lots and lands hereby are determined to be specially benefitted by said improvement and in an amount hereby determined to be specially assessed thereon.

Section 4. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in not less than nine (9) or more than ten (10) equal annual installments with interest upon the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of such assessments.

Section 5. That bonds of said village shall be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of assessments by installments and in an amount sufficient to pay that portion of the estimated cost of said

improvement for which the special assessments are to be levied.

Section 6. That the remainder of the cost of said improvement shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds issued by said village in the manner provided by law.

Section 7. That the clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement according to law.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
