

AN ORDINANCE NO. 352.

By Mr. O. C. Manly.

Determining to proceed with the improvement of the first alley east of Parkview Avenue from Caroline Avenue to Right of way of the B. & O. Railroad Company by constructing a water line therein.

Be it ordained by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio;

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of the first alley east of Parkview Avenue from Caroline Avenue to the Right of way of the B. & O. Railroad Company by constructing a four inch water line therein, in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles therefor, prepared by the engineers of said village, which plans, etc. ^{were} heretofore approved and are now on file with the village clerk, and in pursuance of the resolution 274, declaring it necessary to make said improvement, adopted April 26, 1922.

Section 2. That all claims for damage for making said improvement shall be judicially inquired into after the completion thereof, and the solicitor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement upon the following lots and lands to-wit: Lots number ten (10), eleven (11), twelve (12), and thirteen (13) in Bexley Heights addition to said village, which lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement, and in an amount hereby determined to be specially assessed thereon.

Section 4. That the whole assessment so to be levied shall be paid in cash to the village treasurer within ten days after notice of the date of the passage of the ordinance levying the assessment, and in default of such payment the assessment shall be forthwith certified to the tax duplicate for collection as other taxes with interest at six per cent (6%) and penalties as provided by law.

Section 5. That said assessment when collected shall be used by the village treasurer to reimburse the ^{cumulative} ~~water~~ or other fund of said village for money temporarily appropriated and expended therefrom to pay the cost of said improvement.

Section 6. That the clerk is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement according to law.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
