

AN ORDINANCE NO. 353.

Determining to proceed with the improvement of Columbia Avenue from Caroline Avenue to the right of way of the B. & O. Railroad Company, by constructing a water line therein.

Be it ordained by the council of the Village of Berwyn, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Columbia Avenue from the center line of Caroline Avenue to the center line of Delmar Avenue in Berwyn Heights addition to said village by constructing a six inch water line therein, with necessary fire hydrants together with a four inch line therefrom in Delmar Avenue to tie in with a line constructed in the first alley east of Parkview Avenue, in accordance with the plans, estimates, and profiles therefore prepared by the engineers of said village, which plans, etc. were heretofore approved and are now on file in the office of the village clerk, and in pursuance of the resolution No. 275, Declaring it necessary to make said improvement, adopted April 26, 1922.

Section 2. That all claims for damages for making said improvement shall be judicially inquired into after the completion thereof, and the solicitor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement upon the following lots and lands, to-wit: Lot numbers fourteen (14), fifteen (15), sixteen (16), seventeen (17), thirty-four (34), thirty-five (35), thirty-six (36) & thirty-seven (37) and thirty-eight (38), of Berwyn Heights addition to said village, which lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement and in an amount hereby determined to be assessed thereon.

Section 4. That the whole assessment so to be levied shall be paid in cash to the village treasurer within ten days after notice of the passage of the ordinance levying the same, and in default of such payment the assessments shall be forthwith returned to the tax duplicate and collected as other taxes with interest at six per cent per annum as provided by law.

Section 5. That said assessments, when collected, shall be used by the treasurer of the village to reimburse the ^{sundry bond} water or other fund of said village for money temporarily appropriated and expended therefrom to pay the cost of said improvement.

Section 6. That the clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement according to law.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
